letter from the president



Dear Friends,

Twenty years is a long time. As President of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation, I have had the privilege of leading the foundation for the past two years.

This 20th anniversary edition of the Annual Report is a celebration and look back on *your* community foundation. An anniversary is a time to honor the past...and anticipate the future.

The Wabash Valley Community
Foundation was formed in 1991
through the volunteer efforts of
Don Springman, Sally Lowery and
Ed Jukes, the board of Community
Chest of Terre Haute at that time. The
Community Foundation was created
to participate in Lilly Endowment's
"Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow"
or "GIFT" initiative.

The Foundation's first Board of Directors was committed to putting donor intention at the forefront of everything it did. Thanks to the Endowment's matching GIFT opportunity, many people and organizations became involved in the fledgling organization. Early in its existence, Del and Betty Jones gave \$1 million to the Foundation, which leveraged \$500,000 from Lilly Endowment and brought credibility to this new organization.

After a successful start, the Community Foundation expanded its services to the citizens of Clay County in 1997 and Sullivan County in 1998.

The Community Foundation measures success not only by the size of its assets, but also by the number and amount of its grants. I want to share a few facts that illustrate the difference that the Foundation is making in our community right now.

This year, the Community Foundation made grants to more than 50 different nonprofit agencies. It provided nearly \$900,000 in scholarship support to students from Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties. Over the past 20 years, grant dollars from the Foundation have:

- helped to make a performing arts experience available – and affordable – for area children and their families;
- transformed lives through the support of an employment opportunity program for the developmentally disabled;
- saved and enhanced quality of life through disease prevention and cardiac health awareness programs;
- provided life-saving comfort through utility support and food programs;
- preserved historical structures through restoration of a county courthouse clock, clock tower and more:

- enhanced parks and recreation facilities and programs in numerous communities;
- saved lives through the purchase of equipment for emergency service providers;
- provided dictionaries to all third grade students in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties each school year;
- provided the basic needs of food, clothing and shelter for area families;
- and the list goes on and on.

Since its launch, the Foundation has distributed more than \$12 million to agencies and programs to benefit residents in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties. That is a successful past, but what about the future?

Imagine the Wabash Valley as we would like it to be in 2016, 2021 and beyond. We could have:

- a community with enough scholarships so that all students who want to continue their education beyond high school have the funds to do so;
- a community whose social service organizations no longer have to scramble for cash to meet the needs of their clients;
- a community where the government, education, business and social service sectors work together to solve their most pressing issues;

- a community that supports its emerging musicians and artists and then enjoys the wonderful cultural opportunities that these talents provide;
- a community that is known across the state and across the nation as a place that invests in its youth;
- a community where economic development is at the forefront of everyone's mission and a place where new jobs are created at such a pace that people want to put down roots and stay here.

If we can imagine it, we can make it happen. Through the Community Foundation we can forge partnerships, convene parties around a table, lead by example, leverage funds and enable philanthropy. As citizens of the Wabash Valley, it is our responsibility to develop the dream and build it for those who will follow us.

With all of us working together, our collective vision of the future can indeed happen. With your help and support, we can make sure it does!

the roots of philanthropy in the wabash valley

In many ways, the founding of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation in 1991 changed the face of philanthropy in our communities.

Behind the numbers you see throughout our 20th Anniversary Annual Report are the stories of our donors and their legacies...the stories of our grant recipients and their commitment to make the community a better place.

The roots of philanthropy in the Wabash Valley go back to 1882 and the Society for Organized Charity. Dedicated to relief for the poor, it was Terre Haute's first federated fundraising body. Through the years, philanthropy was carried out by successive groups, including the Welfare League (1919), the Terre Haute Community Fund (1920 to 1932) and the Health-Welfare Fund (1936 to 1941).

In 1942, Community Chest of Terre Haute Inc. was organized to coordinate the activities of the various agencies providing welfare, health or recreational services to the public. The United Appeal, the Community Chest's fundraising arm, began in 1957 and evolved to become the United Way of the Wabash Valley in 1972.

Community Chest was instrumental in organizing the Wabash Valley Community Foundation Inc. in 1991. By transferring its assets to create the Community Chest Fund, Community Chest made one of the very first gifts to the Community Foundation. Six years later, when the Terre Haute Day Nursery closed its doors after 105 years of caring for the children of low-income parents, it too became a part of the Foundation. Its board established the Terre Haute Day Nursery Fund, which continues to carry on its mission.

Because of the generosity of Wabash Valley residents like the first major donors, Delmar and Betty Jones; the Foundation's affiliation with the Clay County Community Foundation and the Sullivan County Community Foundation; Lilly Endowment's five GIFT initiatives; and the able stewardship of the endowment through the years, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation has experienced phenomenal growth. From nothing, the Foundation's endowed assets have grown to nearly \$30 million, making it possible to award more than \$12 million in cumulative grants and scholarships.

lilly endowment's impact

A \$1 million endowment building grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. was the impetus for the creation of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. Lilly Endowment, the Indianapolis-based, private family foundation, exists to support the causes of religion, community development and education. With its 1990 GIFT initiative (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow), the Endowment dedicated more than \$60.1 million to establish and strengthen community foundations in Indiana. The Wabash Valley Community Foundation raised \$2 million in permanently endowed funds by 1994 to receive the \$1 million in GIFT I funds. But the Endowment's impact didn't stop there.

- The Endowment's GIFT initiatives were designed to strengthen Indiana communities by creating a permanent source of charitable dollars and encouraging local leaders to identify and solve local problems. Through 13 years and five GIFT phases, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation was the beneficiary of more than \$8.7 million in GIFT funds.
- The Endowment's Community Scholarship Program, kicked off in 1997, has made it possible for the Community Foundation to offer four-year, full-tuition scholarships so that 108 high school students in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties could pursue their educational dreams at any accredited Indiana institution of higher education.
- The Endowment's significant Community Alliances Promoting Education (CAPE) grants, from 2001 to 2005, made it possible for Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties to address literacy issues and increase educational attainment in partnership with the school corporations and area institutions of higher education.
- With a \$384,6670 grant from Lilly Endowment, the Community Foundation implemented its Sustaining Resource Development (SRD) initiative in 2005 and achieved goals of increasing awareness of the Foundation, educating and utilizing volunteers in development efforts, and developing and maintaining sufficient operating resources.



community expo celebrates the foundation's 20th anniversary and area nonprofits The Wabash Valley Community Foundation celebrated its 20th anniversary by showcasing the services of more than 40 area nonprofit agencies at its Community Expo at Hulman Center on September 15th.

Nearly 550 residents of Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties joined in the celebration and voted for their favorite agency. The top vote recipients that evening shared in the \$20,000, which was added to their agency endowments.

We were presented with the Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce's 2011 Vision – A Level Above Award for our work to grow our communities for the future. We also achieved reconfirmation of compliance with National Standards from the Council on Foundations.





many ways to embrace philanthropy

The Community Foundation has been built on the gifts of our generous donors, each one a philanthropist, no matter the size of the gift. Gifts to the Foundation are as varied as the donors and the needs for which they are intended. Your financial, tax or estate planner, assisted by the staff at the Community Foundation, can help you select the type of gift that best suits your situation.

- Cash is the easiest way to donate, whether it is actual cash in hand or a check. The Foundation's online giving opportunity makes it convenient to give.
- Real estate or personal property may be given to the Foundation. Of course, all gifts qualify as a charitable tax deduction.
- Appreciated securities, when donated, allow you to avoid paying the capital gains tax while providing an accompanying income tax deduction for the current fair-market value.
- **Testamentary gifts**, such as a bequest in your will, allow the gift amount to be exempt from estate taxes.
- Transferring life insurance, with the Foundation named as the beneficiary and owner of an existing or new policy, allows you an immediate tax deduction, which usually approximates the cash surrender value of the policy. Insurance premiums paid after the transfer of the policy may be deductible as a charitable contribution.
- A charitable remainder trust allows you or someone you choose to receive an income for life from assets transferred to a trust. The transfer also qualifies as a tax deduction, the amount of which is determined by the age of the income recipient. When the trust ends, the trust remainder is placed in a permanent fund in your name with the charitable distributions made in accordance with your wishes.
- A charitable gift annuity is a simple way to make a substantial gift while retaining the right to a lifetime income. The amount of income is fixed, based on your life expectancy. When the income is no longer needed, the remainder supports the charitable cause you have selected.

- A charitable lead trust allows the Foundation to receive an annual payment during your lifetime or for a specified number of years. When the trust terminates, the principal is returned to you or others that you have designated.
- Private foundations or trusts often require significant time and money to manage. By transferring your private foundation or charitable trust to the Community Foundation, all responsibilities for reports and administrative duties will be carried out by the staff of the Foundation. Since the Foundation is a public charity and does not pay excise tax, more income is available for charitable purposes.
- The Acorn Program allows everyone to be a philanthropist. To create a fund in the Foundation requires a contribution of \$5,000 or more. If it is not possible to give a large gift or to donate the \$5,000 all at once in order to establish a permanent fund, the Foundation's Acorn Program is an alternate way to create a fund. A minimum contribution of \$100 opens the account with a commitment on your part to have it grow to the required \$5,000 within five years. As resources become available, you may make contributions to your fund. Family members and friends also may contribute to your fund in the Foundation. You don't have to be a millionaire to help your community.

Professional Guidance. No matter how much or which type of resources you choose to donate, the Community Foundation will make it possible for you to have a charitable fund without all the red tape and legal fees. Your fund will be invested by professional investment managers and monitored by a board composed of local leaders who know your community and will seek to honor your wishes.

wabash valley gives

2011 provided a new donor opportunity for the Wabash Valley. We introduced our online community engagement platform, Wabash Valley Gives, where people can learn about and assist directly with a variety of needs in their own communities. The platform, funded by several area private and corporate foundations and managed by the Foundation, is free to nonprofit organizations needing assistance. No gift is too small, and donors can be assured that the platform is a safe, secure place to make donations. Please check it out at www.wabashvalleygives.com!

many ways to create your fund

The Community Foundation can customize a fund that will achieve your personal charitable goals and establish your legacy.

Unrestricted Funds

If you wish to provide resources for your community to meet future needs, assist an existing program or even start a new program, the unrestricted fund will be your choice. Your resources will be granted by the local board for purposes which are meaningful and timely in your county.

Field of Interest Funds

Perhaps you have an interest in the arts, education, youth or a specific geographic area. Once you define your particular interest, the Foundation board will award grants from your fund within the area you have identified.

Advised Funds

You may wish to have more "say" in the annual distributions from your fund. By choosing an advised fund, you may serve on or specify who will serve on the grant selection committee. Each year you can recommend different charitable grantees.

Designated Funds

If you are devoted to one or more charitable organizations, you may wish to establish a designated fund, thereby assuring that your favorite charity or charities will receive annual grants from your endowed resources.

Agency Endowment Funds

An agency itself or a long-time supporter may establish an agency endowment fund for the agency's benefit. An agency endowment fund allows supporters to contribute funds to ensure an uninterrupted and dependable source of funding to carry out the agency's work on a perpetual basis.

Scholarship Funds

A scholarship fund will assist students with tuition and fees to pursue a post-secondary education. Unlike generic scholarships, a Community Foundation scholarship can be customized to incorporate the donor's preferences for a particular field of study or a particular institution of higher education. Eligibility of applicants, application procedures and the amount and duration of scholarship support are designed to reflect the wishes of the donor.

Deferred Funds

The Community Foundation can work with you now to create a fund agreement that will not receive any gift from you until some time in the future, perhaps as a part of your estate plan. The Community Foundation will work cooperatively with your financial planner, attorney or accountant to ensure that your wishes are properly followed when the deferred gift is received.

Special Project Funds

Immediacy is an element in the Foundation's Special Projects Funds. Perhaps a new project emerges, a need arises or a nonprofit group requests fundraising assistance from the Foundation. Rather than establish a permanent endowment, resources are given to support these special short-term goals now.

Acknowledgement

All donors to the Community
Foundation are acknowledged,
regardless of the size of their gift.
Should a donor prefer anonymity,
the Wabash Valley Community
Foundation protects the identity and
confidentiality of the donor.

6 building agency endowments

A nonprofit agency pursuing its mission to benefit the community may struggle to pay its staff and keep its doors open. The Community Foundation provides support for nonprofits through agency endowments that can supplement nonprofits' operating budgets with a reliable annual stream of income. In 1997, Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT Phase III initiative provided \$1 million, which was leveraged to create and increase agency endowment funds in the Foundation. Today, local agencies or their benefactors have established 79 agency endowments in the Community Foundation.



20 years of grantmaking

The Wabash Valley Community Foundation continues to be a charitable vehicle that donors give *through* rather than *to*. It is a collection of various funds, each one as individual as its creator, and each one designed to improve the community.

The Foundation exists to help donors – both those of wealth and those of modest means – to carry out their charitable objectives forever. At the same time, it is committed to the improvement of the Wabash Valley, providing a steady source of financial resources to respond to changing community needs and positively impact quality of life.

To this end, the Foundation links agencies and organizations with donors' charitable goals and community needs. Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties each have their own individual review process, carried out by local volunteer leadership, to determine the agencies and projects to be funded. The resulting grants have enriched arts and culture, boosted community development, supported educational opportunity, assisted in emergencies and crises, and supported citizens in times of need and despair. The figures below demonstrate the level of support for each broad interest area.

Funds in the Community Foundation operate as perpetual endowments from which only the annual income is distributed, while the principal stays intact. Gifts grow and are leveraged with other gifts, thus allowing the Foundation to make larger grants with greater impact.

Arts and Culture

249 Grants Totaling \$1,013,328.25

One measure of the quality of life in any community is the diversity of its arts and cultural opportunities. Grants to provide these opportunities to the Wabash Valley include support for the preservation of historic buildings and landmarks in all three counties; support for concert programming for the Terre Haute Symphony and for exhibits at the Swope Art Museum and Terre Haute Children's Museum; and scholarships for children in the Terre Haute Children's Choir.

Community Development

492 Grants Totaling \$2,838,847.35

Community development can mean creating job opportunities that will result in a better standard of living for residents. But in the communities of Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties, it can also mean maintaining services that keep those communities safe, viable and alive. To help make that happen, the Foundation has granted funding for equipment, training, and even K-9 protection for local law enforcement and emergency response agencies; improvements to community centers and recreation facilities, including youth leagues, pools and parks; technology upgrades to promote business development; humane shelter support; and development and beautification of downtowns and neighborhoods.

Education

453 Grants Totaling \$1,993,166.35

Regardless of age, education is a lifelong pursuit. In addition to its scholarship program, the Community Foundation has funded a variety of grants to support educational opportunities for all ages, from toddlers to non-traditional students. Education-related grants have included installing and upgrading Internet technology; creating outdoor classrooms and other special learning areas; supporting the educational needs of disadvantaged children; providing special reading and after-school tutoring programs; training educators and mentors; supporting alternative education; and funding adult and family literacy programs.

Social Services

1,219 Grants Totaling \$4,032,230.22

By far the largest grant area, in both number and dollar amount of grants, is the area that addresses human needs. Over the years this has included grants to improve access to healthcare; provide facilities, programming and services at community centers; assure quality daycare for working families; create opportunities for adults and children with disabilities; provide emergency services; feed, clothe and house the disadvantaged; and support families with education and counseling.

Religion

454 Grants Totaling \$626,875.63

Donors with an interest in the work of a particular congregation or mission may set up an endowment fund that provides grants in support of their chosen church or program.

Scholarships

893 Scholarships Totaling \$5,514,094.43

Every year the post secondary education dreams of area students are given a boost from the Community Foundation's scholarship funds. Many of the scholarships are generic in nature, but many are customized to the donor's preference as to field of interest or institution of higher learning.

notable grants in all sizes

Every one of the nearly 3,000 grants awarded by the Community Foundation in its 20 years has impacted the lives of residents in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties. Here are some notable ones.

- Access to the arts is important in all three of the Foundation's counties. A \$500 grant assisted with the start-up of the Sullivan Community Band. Community Theatre of Clay County was awarded \$3,000 from no fewer than 10 endowment funds to update its lighting. Grants have supported Sheldon Swope Art Museum's Summer Art Program for Youth, which continues today, and Art Spaces received grants in support of two outdoor sculptural placements.
- In our 10th Anniversary year, a \$100,000 grant established a trailhead at the eastern terminus of the National Road Heritage Trail in East Glenn commemorating Delmar and Betty Jones' outstanding support of the Foundation. That grant leveraged an additional \$539,515 for the trailhead from the State of Indiana.
- A special project fund assists the Veterans Memorial Plaza on the grounds of the Vigo County Courthouse to honor the county's fallen war heroes.
- In 2009, the Foundation announced a \$150,000 endowment building challenge grant to the Terre Haute Children's Museum to develop sustained funding to cover operational costs for the museum's new facility.
- Volunteer fire departments are the first responders for any emergency and are critical to the safety of residents in our rural areas. VFDs in Clay and Sullivan counties have been awarded numerous grants for new communication for new communications systems, external defibrillators, extrication tools, trucks, protective gear and training materials to support their efforts.
- Poverty and a lack of resources limit access to healthcare for Wabash Valley residents. Since 1997, the Community Foundation has provided nearly \$89,000 in grants to help St. Ann Clinic, which provides free healthcare services to thousands of people who are at or below the poverty level and do not have a physician or medical insurance.

response

When the worst flooding the Wabash Valley had seen in 95 years poured into homes and businesses on Saturday, June 7, 2008, lives were disrupted and thousands fled to temporary shelters. That day, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation made a \$50,000 emergency grant to help the Wabash Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross provide flood victims with fresh water, shelter, food and supplies for personal hygiene. The Foundation became a lead partner in forming the Wabash Valley Long Term Disaster Recovery Coalition, which coordinated volunteers, churches and response agencies in Vigo. Clay, Sullivan, Vermillion and Parke counties, assessing unmet needs and providing funding to put families back on their feet. Thanks to a statewide grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to the Indiana Association of United Ways, the Coalition was able to help 100% of families who qualified for assistance.

The Wabash Valley Community Foundation was one of the lead partners in establishing the Wabash Valley Long Term Disaster Recovery Coalition. In conjunction with the Coalition, volunteers - both local and from across the nation - helped to restore homes after the 2008 flood.

youth grant

The Youth Grant Committee involves teens in grant review and funding decisions for service learning projects designed and organized by other youths. Since the program was formed in 1996, the committees have awarded grants of more than \$79,000 to projects designed and implemented by young people. Committee members, who are students in grades 8 through 12, are trained in aspects of grantmaking. The 2007 committee established an \$8,000 permanent endowment that continues to benefit youth community service projects and promote a community of caring for coming generations of philanthropists.

15 notable gifts received

Our communities have benefited immeasurably from the generosity of thousands of donors over our 20-year history. Every gift is important, and every donor has been recognized in our annual reports, since the first one in 1993. Here are some of our notable gifts.

- Our first major endowment contribution was a \$1 million gift made in 1992 by Delmar and Betty Jones. By taking advantage of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT I initiative, the Jones Family assured the success of the Foundation. Since that original gift, the Community Foundation has had eight other donors who have contributed assets exceeding \$1 million each.
- The two largest gifts from individuals came from Clarabelle Conklin, who created the Dr. and Mrs. James Conklin Scholarship Fund, and from Dr. Charlotte M. Boener to fund science education scholarships at Indiana State University.
- The two largest corporate donors are Lilly Endowment, at more than \$10 million through its various GIFT initiatives, the CAPE initiative, Taking Stock and Sustaining Resource Development; and Harris Bank, which transferred 22 charitable trusts to the Foundation with assets totalling more than \$4.5 million
- The Community Foundation has 54 different donors who individually have contributed cumulative gifts totaling more than \$100,000.





16 affiliates join us

In 1997, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation magnified its impact by expanding to include adjoining counties interested in forming their own affiliate foundations. Before long, both Clay and Sullivan counties took full advantage of this opportunity. Thanks to the efforts of their hardworking local volunteers, each of our affiliates has:

- built a sizable endowment focusing on the needs within their counties;
- participated in Lilly Endowment's GIFT and other initiatives;
- awarded scholarships and grants within their counties;
- enhanced education within their counties through \$5 million CAPE grants from Lilly Endowment;
- functioned with autonomy, supported by the structure, staffing and counsel of the Foundation;
- distributed funds annually for community improvements; and
- continually sought out new endowments to strengthen their own counties forever.

Clay County

The Clay Civic Memorial Foundation established the Clay County Community Foundation in 1997, taking advantage of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT Phase III to build a permanent charitable endowment for the county. In 2006, the Civic Foundation combined its resources with those of the Community Foundation, placing \$150,000 in unrestricted funds and \$150,000 in an advised fund. Board member Mike Lawson explained, "I think it's important for previous benefactors to know (the Civic Foundation's work) will continue through the Advised Fund."

Sullivan County

In 1998, community leaders in Sullivan County came together to take advantage of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT Phase III matching funds opportunity and established the Sullivan County Community Foundation. In that first year, most of the funds went toward building the Foundation's endowment for the long term. Founding board member Malinda Medsker said, "The Sullivan County Community Foundation has given the people of Sullivan County a way to help and to be helped. Donors can make an impact on their community forever by giving small donations to various funds or by establishing an endowment fund to help their favorite charity or provide scholarships to benefit Sullivan County students. The money that has been given in grants and scholarships would never have been available without the Community Foundation."

foundation guidance

From its beginning, the growth and development of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation has been guided by a dedicated board of directors and a knowledgeable staff. Along the way, staff and board members have undergone training, attended seminars, conducted self-assessments, revised policies and refined the vision and mission to increase the organization's efficiency and effectiveness. In 2006 and again in 2011, the Foundation achieved compliance with the National Standards for Community Foundations from the Council on Foundations, which evidences its commitment to excellence for its communities and donors. Other accomplishments include:

- Implementing the Sustaining Resource Development initiative in 2005 with a \$384,000 grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to increase awareness of the Foundation in the community, educate and utilize its volunteers in development efforts, and develop and maintain sufficient operating resources.
- Establishing the Wabash Valley Community Foundation Operating Endowment Fund in 1994, and with assistance in 2005 from the SRD initiative, adding more than \$767,000.
- Instituting a new investment policy, a new scholarship application and review process, and a combined grant application so all three counties follow the same grant guidelines, all in 2006.
- Engaging Fund Evaluation Group (FEG) as an investment consultant in 2007 to take advantage of its extensive experience in advising community foundations to improve the investment return for the benefit of the community.
- Being one of seven Indiana community foundations to be selected by the Indiana Grantmakers Alliance to take part in a pilot program, the "Community of Effective Practices" in 2009.
- Being one of 11 foundations in Indiana and Ohio chosen to participate in the Community Leadership Cluster peer-learning program sponsored by CFLeads and the Council on Foundations in 2010.

18 community collaborations

The Wabash Valley Community
Foundation has evolved from a
grantmaking "charitable bank" to
an involved community partner taking
a leadership role in positive change.
The Foundation has:

- Partnered with area school corporations and higher education institutions to bring more than \$12 million into the area through grants from private foundations outside the Wabash Valley.
- Sponsored skill-building seminars for nonprofit organizations, underwriting a significant portion of the cost to help staffs and volunteers to do their jobs more effectively and efficiently.
- Formed collaborative efforts to assist the community, such as in 2008 when it partnered with area agencies to form the Wabash Valley Long Term Disaster Recovery Coalition, the group that assessed unmet flood-related needs and helped 405 families get back on their feet.
- Encouraged community collaborations with its "Better Together" initiative, which encourages nonprofit agencies to tackle common challenges. The first two \$25,000 were awarded grants in 2011.
