Dear Friends,



We often hear the phrase, “It’s in our nature,” usually as a predicate to something people will do. For those involved in the Wabash Valley Community Foundation, whether as contributors, volunteers or staff, it’s in our nature to care about the communities where we live, work, play and pray. We want to better our world. We just can’t help it. *It’s in our nature.*

In 2013 the Wabash Valley celebrated the “Year of the River,” focusing attention on our relationship to and dependence upon the Wabash River. The river’s tributaries are physical in that they touch every part of Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties. Its presence nourishes our bodies, our spirits and our souls. In many ways, it is why we are here, celebrating our own sense of place in a global community.

A \$25,000 Community Foundation grant helped “Year of the River” sponsors coordinate the efforts of dozens of arts and cultural organizations to plan and carry out events that reached thousands of people, reminding them that a river runs through the heart of this place. This celebration gave us opportunities to reflect upon the importance of the river in our nature. While we first think of the river as part of our natural environment, it helps to sustain us in many ways.

Similarly the Wabash Valley Community Foundation sustains and nourishes our communities. Just as the Wabash River is a renewable resource requiring our

careful attention and protection, the Community Foundation too serves as a renewable resource for our communities. The very concept of endowment is to sustain the wishes of our donors who come to us to do good, forever. It’s in our nature.

And just as a healthy river demands stewardship and responsible use, so the Community Foundation demands careful stewardship of its resources to invest our gifts responsibly and conservatively with an eye toward future generations. We are proud that our 12% annual return on investment this year compares favorably with our peers.

For the Community Foundation, careful stewardship means involving individuals from our communities in performing due diligence in grant and scholarship requests, and it means protecting the privacy and integrity of those we serve with conformance to ethical principles. This year, the Foundation awarded 141 scholarships valued at \$540,442.13 and 315 grants totaling \$830,603 to worthy organizations for the betterment of those who choose to make the Wabash Valley their home.

It’s in our nature to demand a high degree of sustainability in the Foundation’s internal and external processes. To that end, the Board and staff have begun reviewing all of the organization’s operations to make sure we not only live within our means, but also that we do so efficiently and effectively, ensuring that we carry out all of our promises.

And it’s in our nature to find new ways for our communities to support worthy causes. This year, 100+ Women Who Care (actually 218 women) stepped forward, committing more than \$80,000 annually to worthy causes in Vigo County and building a \$22,000 endowment fund.

The environment we live in includes natural and man-made elements. And most importantly, it includes men, women and children, their efforts to survive, learn and prosper and their relationships with each other and the natural environment.

The projects supported by the Wabash Valley Community Foundation are as diverse as the people who live here and decide what is important to them. It is an incredible engine for progress and one of the many things in the Wabash Valley that engenders a sincere sense of pride in place.

And that is in our nature, too. ☺

It's in Our Nature To Give

The people of the Wabash Valley have long been known for their giving nature. As far back as 1882, concerned citizens in Terre Haute formed the Society for Organized Charity, the first “federated” effort to improve the health and welfare of the area’s needy.

In 1942 the Community Chest of Terre Haute assumed that role, and 50 years later its board was instrumental in forming the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. The Clay Civic Memorial Foundation has a long tradition of helping people in Clay County, as do many other organized giving efforts in all three counties. Concerned women have united to improve lives with efforts like the League of Terre

Haute’s dental care program and Clothes Closet, the Women’s Club’s shoe bus, and in 2013, the founding of 100+ Women Who Care.

Of course not all “charity” in the Wabash Valley is “organized.” People reach out daily to help others. We see it in Sullivan County when neighbors gather donations for a family that lost its home in a fire, in Clay County where collection cans at convenience stores raise funds to help the

victim of a serious illness, and in all counties as people donate what they can to assure that those less fortunate have a brighter holiday.

This giving nature unites all the communities and all the people of the Wabash Valley.

For more than 20 years, the Foundation has been testimony to the giving nature of the Wabash Valley, and thanks to our citizens’ generous nature, our endowment has grown to \$40 million. We grant more than \$1.3 million annually in funds to make a positive impact on the arts and culture, community development, education, health and human services, religion, and special and emergency needs. Nearly 7,000 donors of varying means have contributed to support the causes that touch their hearts.

This Annual Report tells the story of just some of the ways our donors’ giving nature benefited the Wabash Valley in 2013.

WETLANDS OFFER A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY

The Wabashiki Wetlands is a unique facet of the area that not many communities have so near a metropolitan center. The Wetlands initiative can be traced back to the River Committee of Terre Haute Tomorrow, an organization created in the early 2000s to improve Terre Haute and the surrounding communities. Over the course of a few years, the River Committee acquired much of the land on the west bank of the Wabash near West Terre Haute—7,000 acres located in the river bottoms that flooded frequently.

In 2010, then Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels announced an expansion of the Wetlands initiative that would turn the original 7,000 acres into an enormous 43,000-acre initiative under the name Wabashiki, the Native Indian name for the Wabash River. A true gem for the Wabash Valley, the effects of this initiative are expected to be felt in multiple areas from wildlife to recreational activity to economic growth for the Terre Haute area.

One aspect of the Wabashiki Wetlands involves expansion of the National Road Heritage Trail to and along the Wabash River. The first mile of that trail was made possible in 2008 with the help of a \$30,000 Lilly Endowment Fund grant through the Community Foundation, which enabled Wabash River Development and Beautification, Inc. to leverage a matching grant of nearly \$128,000 from the Indiana Recreational Trails Program.

In October 2013, the final master plan was unveiled for Dewey Point Trailhead as a part of that trail. The trailhead is named after Susie Dewey,



a long-time educator, naturalist and Bronze Star recipient for her service in World War II. Susie purchased and donated the land to be used as part of the Wabashiki project, land which would likely have become a commercial property. “I was certainly delighted to save it for nature,” she said.

The Dewey Point site fronts East National Drive (U.S. 40) and is adjacent to a levee trail around part of the wetland area that will connect

to the National Road Heritage Trail. Dewey Point will include a pavilion, wetland observation area, overlook and trail leading to a canoe/kayak launch into Wabashiki Fish & Wildlife area, affording citizens a unique opportunity to experience the Wabash River.

In 2013 the Wabash Valley celebrated the Year of the River with arts, cultural, environmental and educational events focusing on the Wabash River. Because a river is affected by its entire watershed, representatives from counties immediately around Vigo in the west

central Indiana Wabash River watershed were involved in the project. A \$25,000 grant from the Wabash Valley Community Foundation helped to fund plans for the celebration, which was spearheaded by Art Spaces, Inc. - Wabash Valley Outdoor Sculpture Collection; Arts Illiana; and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology Permanent Art Collections.

Understanding that the river is the reason that people first settled in the area, more than 50 organizations came together to reclaim, enhance and protect this valuable natural resource. Hundreds of people experienced events that included a Big Read, a Native American mound celebration, concerts, plays, nature walks, an outdoor art festival, cleanup projects, a poetry competition, art exhibits, historical exhibits, group prayer sessions, murals, discussion series, lectures, tree plantings, duck races, a midnight run, a mural, a photo contest, hands-on classes and more.

The Wabash Valley Community Foundation is a unique philanthropic organization. It provides a way for the giving nature of the Wabash Valley to be sustained, even beyond the lifetime of the giver. And it offers the means to maximize the impact of a single gift by combining it with hundreds of others for a greater return, resulting in a larger pool of available dollars for doing good.

THE POWER OF THE ENDOWMENT

Sustaining the power of a gift beyond the lifetime of its giver was demonstrated at the Foundation's Power of the Endowment Luncheon on April 11. Among the more than \$114,500 in grant funds awarded to 16 Vigo County organizations and programs that day was one that represented a milestone for the Foundation.

The \$5,000 grant awarded to Indiana State University's Coach-a-Vet program from the Delmar L. and Betty L. Jones Family Fund represented the one-millionth dollar granted from that fund. According

to Foundation Executive Director Beth Tevlin, "The true significance of this grant is that the Jones Family gave the Community Foundation \$1 million to start this fund (the first to be established in the fledgling Foundation in 1991). The Foundation has now granted out more than the original gift, and still has assets of more than \$1 million in the Jones Family Fund. That is the power of the endowment."

Board President Fred Nation said the Jones' trust in the Foundation early on was the best demonstration of the power of endowments, the power of philanthropy and the power of the good the Foundation continues to do in the community.

100+ WOMEN WHO CARE

A philanthropic group founded in 2013 offered a new way to pool dollars for maximum impact. Starting out as 100 Women Who Care, the organization grew to more than 200 women and surpassed \$100,000 in giving in its first year. Fueled by a common desire to give back to the local community and with a \$500-per-person annual commitment, the group contributed nearly \$22,000 to the 100+ Women Who Care Endowment Fund in the Wabash Valley Community Foundation.

Giving in the group's inaugural year included \$17,500 to the Council on Domestic Abuse for much-needed improvements to its shelter; \$20,300 to Art Spaces to help make the Paul Dresser sculpture, "A Song for Indiana," a reality; \$20,400 to the Swope Art Museum for window replacement; and \$21,700 to Catholic Charities Foodbank to help feed the hungry in the Wabash Valley.

ENJOYING THE OUTDOORS.

It's in Our Nature.

In the Wabash Valley, enjoying our natural environment is in our nature! Whether it's bird-watching, hiking, biking, fishing, gardening, planting trees or just observing and learning, the natural world that surrounds us is a vital part of our lives. Each year, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation's grants include many that help to sustain, develop, expand, protect and enjoy our natural environment.

RENEWING FOREST PARK

Whether from storms, drought, disease or natural causes, parks in the Wabash Valley are susceptible to loss of their mature and stately trees. Forest Park in Brazil is no exception, and the Clay Community Parks Association is determined to replace as many of Forest Park's dying trees as possible.

"Planting trees in Forest Park is a continual project," said long-time Parks Association member Wilmadean Baker. Due to the 2012 drought, 28 dead trees needed to be cut down and the stumps removed. This was accomplished thanks to a \$10,000 Clay County Community Foundation grant from the Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Clay County. With \$6,000 from the Parks Association's memorial fund, hardwoods have been purchased to replace the lost trees and will be planted in Spring 2014.



LEARNING OUTDOORS

The new pavilion will be the center of Hymera Elementary's outdoor classroom.

Exciting things have been happening at Hymera Elementary School, not the least of which is its new outdoor classroom, created with the help of a \$12,500 grant from the Sullivan County Community Foundation General Endowment Fund.

Hymera Elementary has shown a dramatic 32% increase in standardized test scores in the last four years, and math and science scores are also on the rise. With the new outdoor classroom, the staff has moved learning outside, providing real-world applications and hands-on activities.

"We felt an outdoor pavilion would increase science labs in each classroom and provide a great place for teachers to gather their students for class time outside," said Hymera teacher Julie Baker.

Next school year will see major changes within the Northeast School Corporation. Schools will be reconfigured and a number of new children will be coming to Hymera Elementary. "While we may be relocated to a new building on this campus, our current students and new ones coming in will still have access to our outdoor classroom and the opportunities it provides," Julie said.

THROUGH THE FOUNDATION THERE ARE *Many Ways to Give*

Every gift to the Community Foundation, whether large or small, is an expression of the donor's giving nature. Ways to give to the Foundation are as varied as the donors and the needs for which they are intended. Your financial, tax or estate planner, assisted by the staff at the Community Foundation, can help you select the type of gift that best suits your needs.

☞ **Cash** is the easiest way to donate, whether it is actual cash or a check. The Foundation's online giving Platform is a convenient way to give.

☞ **Real estate or personal property** may be given to the Foundation. Of course, all gifts qualify for a charitable tax deduction in the year the gift was made.

☞ **Appreciated securities**, when donated, allow you to avoid paying the capital gains tax while providing an accompanying income tax deduction for the current fair-market value.

☞ **A testamentary gift**, such as a bequest in your will, is one way you can create your charitable legacy.

☞ **Transferring life insurance**, with the Foundation named as the beneficiary and owner of an existing or new policy, allows you an immediate tax deduction, which usually approximates the cash surrender value of the policy. Insurance premiums paid after the transfer of the policy may be deductible as a charitable contribution.

☞ **A charitable remainder trust** allows you or someone you choose to receive an income for life from assets transferred to a trust. The transfer also qualifies as a charitable deduction, the amount of which is determined by the age of the income recipient and the payout rate. When the trust ends, the trust remainder is placed in a permanent fund in your name with the charitable distributions made in accordance with your wishes.

☞ **A charitable gift annuity** is a simple way to make a substantial gift while retaining the right to a lifetime income. The amount of income is fixed, based on your life expectancy. When the income is no longer needed, the remainder supports the charitable cause you have selected.

☞ **A charitable lead trust** allows the Foundation to receive an annual payment during your lifetime or for a specified number of years. When the trust terminates, the principal is returned to you or others that you have designated.

☞ **Private foundations or trusts** often require significant time and money to manage. By transferring your private foundation or charitable trust to the Community Foundation, all responsibilities for reports and administrative duties will be carried out by the staff of the Foundation. Since the Foundation is a public charity and does not pay excise tax, more income is available for charitable purposes.

☞ **A deferred fund** can be created, which will not receive any gift from you until some time in the future, perhaps as a part of your estate plan. The Foundation will work cooperatively with you and your financial planner, attorney or accountant to create an endowment that will ensure that your wishes are properly followed when the deferred gift is received.

Donor Acknowledgement.

All donors to the Community Foundation are acknowledged, regardless of the size of their gift. Should a donor prefer anonymity, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation protects the identity and confidentiality of the donor.

...AND *Many Funds* WE CAN SUPPORT

On the following pages are listed more than 475 funds that have been created by our donors – people like you whose giving nature has motivated them to help others. As a donor to the Community Foundation, you can customize a fund that will support the charitable purposes or organizations that are most important to you.

☞ **Unrestricted Funds.**

If you wish to provide resources for your community to meet future needs, assist an existing program or even start a new one, the unrestricted fund will be your choice. Your resources will be granted by local volunteers in your county for purposes that are meaningful and timely.

☞ **Field of Interest Funds.**

Perhaps you have a particular interest in a specific area or need. It might be the arts, education, or improved services such as health, recreation or fire protection. The Foundation board will award grants from your fund within the area you have set forth in your fund agreement.

☞ **Advised Funds.**

You may wish to have more involvement in the annual distributions from your fund. By choosing an advised fund, you may serve on or specify who will serve on your fund's selection committee. Each year you can recommend a different charitable grantee.

☞ **Designated Funds.**

If you are devoted to one or more charitable organizations, you may wish to establish a designated fund, thereby assuring that your favorite charity or charities will receive annual grants from your endowed resources.

☞ **Agency Endowment Funds.**

An agency may establish an agency endowment fund for its benefit. The agency's supporters may contribute funds to ensure an uninterrupted and dependable source of revenue to carry out its work on a perpetual basis.

☞ **Scholarship Funds.**

A scholarship fund will assist students with tuition and fees to pursue a post-secondary education. Unlike generic scholarships, a scholarship through the Community Foundation can be customized to incorporate the donor's preferences for a particular field of study or a particular institution of higher education. Eligibility of applicants, application procedures and the amount and duration of scholarship support are designed to reflect the wishes of the donor.

☞ **Special Project Funds.**

Immediacy is an element in the Foundation's special projects funds. Perhaps a new project emerges, a need arises or a nonprofit group requests fundraising assistance from the Foundation. Rather than establish a permanent endowment, resources are given to support these "special" short-term goals now.

Creating a Fund.

To create a unique fund bearing the name and purpose you select, a gift of cash or assets valued at \$5,000 or more needs to be placed with the Foundation.

The Acorn Program.

If it is not possible to donate the \$5,000 all at once in order to establish a permanent endowment fund, the Foundation's Acorn Program is an alternate way of giving. A minimum contribution of \$100 opens the account with a commitment on your part to have it grow to the required \$5,000 within five years. As resources become available, you may make contributions to your fund. Family members and friends also may contribute to your fund in the Foundation.

ELEMENTARY TEACHER'S MONETARY BEQUEST ADDS TO HER LIFE'S LEGACY AS EDUCATOR

Florence Rolene Moore's home was on her family's small farm in the Eel River Bottom west of Clay City, but she spent half her life as a teacher in Illinois and distant Indiana cities. When she passed away in October 2011 at the age of 89, Rolene left more than a legacy of knowledge for the children she had taught. She also left a monetary legacy of more than \$163,000 to the Community Foundation.

Her bequest created three funds--the Roll and Dora King Moore Scholarship Fund for Clay City High School graduates preparing to work with mentally and/or physically inconvenienced persons, the Rolene Moore Scholarship Fund for college students studying to become teachers, and the Rolene Moore Fund to benefit the citizens of Clay City.

In choosing teaching, Rolene followed in the footsteps of her mother and aunt. She earned a Bachelor's degree from Eastern Illinois University in 1944 and a Master's degree from Indiana State University in 1958. She taught elementary students at schools in rural Illinois and in Richmond, Plainfield and Clay City, Indiana, as well as special education students during her 23 years at Brazil's Forest Park Elementary School. Even after retiring in 1989 she volunteered with pre-school children in Clay City's Head Start program.





SUPPORTING OUR YOUTH.

It's in Our Nature.

An African proverb tells us, “it takes a village to raise a child,” and this plays out daily in the communities of the Wabash Valley, where it is in our nature to support our young people. Thanks to the generosity of donors, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation is able to provide thousands of dollars in grant funding each year to support the many organizations, facilities and programs that provide services to youth in our communities.

EDUCATION FOR ECONOMIC SUCCESS

Guided by five volunteers from Kellogg's Snacks, second graders at Lost Creek Elementary School learned first-hand what it would be like to work on a real assembly line and what that means to the community they live in. This is just one of the many hands-on experiences provided by Junior Achievement of the Wabash Valley's economics programs for area school children. These programs align with state academic standards,

complement the curriculum and emphasize the importance of staying in school.

With donations, supplies and volunteers from the community, JAWV brings economics lessons into the schools - from managing finances, to understanding job skills, to being better consumers, to becoming entrepreneurs. This year a \$5,000 Community Foundation grant from the James R. Piker, Ada A. Piker and Virginia M. Ginter Memorial Fund bought supplies for the Grade 2 *JA Our Community* program.

JA interim director Peggy Murdock said, “We completed 134 classes with the help of this grant. Teachers tell us how much the kids enjoy these experiences, and we're working to expand the program to other grades.”

A PASSION FOR SKATEBOARDING

Skateboarding has become a mainstream sport with an estimated 13 million participants nationwide. A relatively inexpensive form of exercise for young and old, the sport only requires a skateboard and a safe place to skate. Two Wabash Valley communities have embraced the passion of many of their young people with the recent development of public-use skateparks.

A \$7,500 Community Foundation grant from the Clay Civic Memorial Endowment Fund will mean the Clay Community

Skatepark in Brazil can be completed. Roberta Weliever, project coordinator for the Clay Community Skatepark Committee, said, “This generous donation will give skaters a place to do what they love—skate where they are welcome.” She estimates that hundreds of kids and adults will use the park, located on the northeast corner of Jackson and Wesley Church streets.

In Terre Haute, skateboarders gravitate to Voorhees Park on the city's south side, billed as the second largest skatepark in the state.



PROMOTING AUTISM AWARENESS

Supporting youth with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) through autism awareness building is the mission of the Wabash Valley Local Community Cadre (LCC). It is a program of HANDS in Autism® Interdisciplinary Training and Resource Center at Riley Hospital. The HANDS Center offers training and technical support to school staff, medical and service providers and primary caregivers, as well as to individuals on the autism spectrum, free of charge. A \$3,500 Community Foundation grant from its Lilly Endowment Fund is helping the Wabash Valley LCC expand to enrich autism awareness and build community collaborations in the area.

One program of the Wabash Valley LCC is Next Steps, a seminar for primary caregivers who have a child that has recently been diagnosed with ASD. Next Steps offers them general information about the ASD diagnosis, adjusting to the diagnosis, and how to make appropriate treatment decisions.

HELPING KIDS FIND THEIR VOICE

For children with special needs such as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), verbal communication can be a challenge, and for some this challenge may be associated with behavior disorders. Many are assisted by Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) strategies, communication methods such as gestures, picture boards and electronic devices that supplement

or replace speech or writing for those unable to produce spoken and/or written language.

To be successful, children with ASD who learn AAC strategies need to continue to use them in all types of situations. This past summer Camp Bruce, a communication camp for nonverbal school-aged children, gave 14 local kids that chance as they experienced movement and music, literacy and arts and crafts activities.



The two-week camp was funded through a \$1,700 Community Foundation grant to its sponsor, ARC of Indiana, from the Larry Archer Memorial Fund for Autism Awareness and Understanding.

ISU Graduate Camp Facilitator Kara Bird assists Jawon Kimmons in communicating his needs through an augmentative communication device.

Camp Bruce helps the youngsters, ages four to 14, hone their communication skills using their own methods under the guidance of 20 speech-language graduate clinicians at ISU, who planned and carried out the activities. In the process they learned first-hand how to better assist people with severe communication disabilities.

At Terre Haute's Voorhees Skatepark, which is a California Skatepark design, skaters enjoy the large bowl complex and smaller mini-bowl area linked by a street course. HEALTHY FOOD ACCESS

Terre Haute area residents have a new way to shop for fresh fruits and vegetables, thanks to a number of community partners and a \$17,500 Community Foundation grant from its Lilly Endowment Fund. Loaded with fresh produce, the United Way of the Wabash Valley's Mobile Market makes 16 stops a week in neighborhoods in Terre Haute and West Terre Haute.

Troy Fears, executive director of the UWWV, said the intent of the market, which is open year round, is to make an impact on obesity and other diet-related chronic conditions in the community by approaching them through a healthy eating plan.

He explained that many residents are not able to get to a grocery store to buy fresh produce on a regular basis, and others are not able to afford grocery produce. The Mobile Market will increase the availability of fresh fruit and vegetables to customers by reducing their distance to buy fresh produce by 75% and offering these choices at discounted prices.

"There are so many people in our communities who have to shop at a gas station or a dollar store, but they just don't have access to good, healthy foods, and we're trying to change that," Fears said. He added that the Mobile Market sells produce at discounted rates and accepts food stamps.

An 18-foot trailer carries the produce and is pulled to each location by a pick-up truck. Patrons enter the back door of the trailer, choosing their food as they head to the front where they check out. Fears said the program not only sells food, but also provides information on healthy ways to prepare it. In addition to the Foundation, major funding for the Mobile Market has also come from the Indiana Association of United Ways and local sponsors including Clabber

Girl, Indiana State University, Regional Hospital, Union Hospital, the Vigo County Health Department and Westminster Village.

The United Way is hoping that customers served in the first fully operational year of the Mobile Market will be able to show a 50% increase in their daily consumption of fresh fruit and vegetables. The United Way plans to expand into surrounding communities in the future.

EXPANDED CLIENT SERVICES

Individuals with disabilities and other challenges are served in Sullivan County by Four Rivers Resource Services, Inc. In the 14 southwestern Indiana counties it serves, Four Rivers offers a full range of programs and services that include supported living, group homes, job placement, supported employment, work services and adult day services that are aimed at helping individuals attain self-dependence, natural interdependence and inclusion.

The largest rural public transportation provider in southern Indiana, Four Rivers operates Ride Solution, a coordinated public transportation system operating in Sullivan and nine other counties. The service was in need of a new handicap accessible van to help individuals get to and from employment and volunteer sites and access the community. A \$1,700 Community Foundation grant from the Lois A. Andrews Foundation for Sullivan County helped Four Rivers meet the 20% match needed to purchase the vehicle.

A second Community Foundation grant helped with the purchase of a used multithread embroidery machine that will create jobs for people with disabilities in Sullivan County. The \$6,500 grant was from the Sullivan County Community Foundation General Endowment Fund.

DAY-CARE ASSISTANCE

The Terre Haute Day Nursery Association had operated a day care facility in Terre Haute since 1893, and when it closed in 1997, the members of the Day Nursery Board determined they could best fulfill their mission of providing day care for children in need by creating an endowment fund in the Community Foundation. Today the Terre Haute Day Nursery continues its more than 120-year tradition by having an active membership that reviews grant proposals and requests for funding to benefit children in our area.

As wages fall and child-care expenses rise, more parents find themselves under severe financial stress, caught in a situation where it's difficult for them to afford the care that makes it possible for them to keep working. This year the Terre Haute Day Nursery Endowment Fund assisted such families at three local childcare facilities.

The Woods Day Care/Pre-School, located on the grounds of the motherhouse of the Sisters of

Providence in Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, accepts children ages six months to six years and is one of the highest rated and nationally accredited childcare programs in Indiana. The school's Tuition Assistance Program was awarded a \$5,000 grant to provide tuition assistance to low-income families and those under temporary financial stress.

Terre Haute's United Child Care Center received an \$11,500 grant from the Terre Haute Day Nursery Endowment Fund, which the Center plans to match to provide one-year scholarships for three families. The Center was established in 1969 to provide quality, affordable child care for families of all income levels.

Vigo County CASA, which stands for Court Appointed Special Advocate, recruits and trains community volunteers to advocate and represent abused and neglected children within the juvenile court system. The Vigo County CASA Kids program received a \$9,000 grant from the Terre Haute Day Nursery Endowment Fund so it can provide day-care funding for abused/neglected children when no other funding sources are available.

Today the Terre Haute Day Nursery Association continues its tradition of providing day care for children of families in need.

GRANT PROVIDES CHINESE EXPERIENCES FOR YOUNG SUMMER CAMPERS

Funds for supplies were supported by a \$1,000 Community Foundation grant from the James R. Piker, Ada A. Piker, and Virginia M. Ginter Memorial Fund.

The afternoon sessions at University Hall on the Indiana State University campus included making dumplings, using chopsticks and learning other Chinese food culture, making a paper umbrella, creating kites and mosaics, papermaking, practicing calligraphy and brush writing, knotting, listening to stories and folk tales and performing songs.

The Chinese School of the Wabash Valley was established in 2007 by parents of children adopted from China and parents of Chinese American origin to provide instruction that was not available elsewhere in the community. It offers instruction in the Chinese language (Mandarin) and Chinese culture to all interested persons ages 4 and up.

GRANT LETS INNER CITY CHILDREN EXPRESS THEMSELVES THROUGH ART

This summer, 25 students from the 14th & Chestnut Community Center and Benjamin Franklin Elementary School experienced Street Art!, a nine-week course offered by Indiana State University's Community School of the Arts (CSA). The children were able to attend free of charge thanks in part to a \$2,075 Community Foundation grant from the Myrl and Marie Wilkinson Community Endowment Fund, First Financial Bank Community Endowment Fund and White Family Endowment Fund.

CSA director Petra Nyendick said the program was designed to give the children a chance to learn about art history and to express creativity through hands-on experiences. "An important aspect of this program is to teach students how to create street art in a safe, respectful and vandal-free manner," she said. At the end of the course, their artwork was featured in an exhibition at Turman Gallery on the ISU campus.

CSA, sponsored by ISU's art and theater departments and School of Music, is the only comprehensive educational outreach of its kind in Indiana. It provides hands-on arts-learning experiences for infants through seniors while providing ISU students who are majoring in the arts with opportunities for experiential learning through teaching.

FREEBIRDS SOLUTION CENTER EXPANDS REACH WITH HELP OF GRANT

FreeBirds Solution Center is a locally established, faith-based sober living facility that works with individuals from the Community Foundation's three counties. It offers affordable assistance to alcohol- and drug-addicted men and women by providing a safe place to live that is removed from their previous negative environment and surrounding them with a staff and residents who have recovered and want recovery.

FreeBirds has a main facility at the former Greenwood School on Voorhees Street in Terre Haute. It also operates a women's and two men's honor houses. Thanks to a gift of a house on South First Street, a second women's honor house is being renovated. The exterior work is nearly complete, and with a \$12,000 grant from the Lilly Endowment Fund, FreeBirds will be able to complete renovations to the interior.

Donations like these from the community sustain the program, which has been providing assistance and hope for recovering addicts for nearly 10 years. FreeBirds has received Hamilton Center's Community Service Award, acknowledging its contribution and commitment to recovery in the Terre Haute area.

BEAUTIFYING DOWNTOWN SULLIVAN

In Sullivan, a \$5,000 Community Foundation grant from the Lorene B. and Malcolm Pigg Beautification Fund to Partners for Resources, Inc. is allowing that group to make continuing steps toward downtown improvements focused on attracting more people to downtown Sullivan to patronize local merchants.

Marti Bodine said Partners for Resources will be providing planting islands on the northeast corner of Washington and Main streets, maintaining and upgrading flower boxes on the square and improving the town's Christmas on the Square celebration. Funds could also go toward beautifying a walkway-bikeway connecting the city's new park and downtown.

AWAKENING THE LARK THEATER

The Community Theatre of Clay County is making an important contribution to downtown Brazil improvement with upgrades to its present home, the old Lark Theater, beginning with work on its façade. Community Theatre board member Lee Reberger advised the *Brazil Times* that a facelift was needed to provide long-term durability and to improve the aesthetic appearance for visitors to the theater.

With the help of a \$10,000 Community Foundation grant from the Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Clay County, improvements are being made to the building's façade to address both safety and aesthetic issues. Upgrades will give the old Lark Theater a fresh start and provide theater-goers a much more appealing entrance when attending performances.

It's in Our Nature.

One thing that is certainly in the nature of people in the Wabash Valley is community pride. Whether it's turning out at the high school basketball game, marching in the July 4th parade or pitching in at the annual clean-up day, our pride shows through in communities large and small. Groups in Brazil and Sullivan benefited from community-focused grants in 2013.



PROMOTING EDUCATION.

It's in Our Nature.

In a region with five institutions of higher learning, five public school systems and more than 21,000 students in grades K-12, promoting education is not only in our nature in the Wabash Valley, it's second nature. But education can reach all ages and can happen in any forum. Two local educational programs that are actively assisting teens or adults who get off track in their lives are the Wabash Valley Teen Challenge and the Crisis Pregnancy Center's Earn While You Learn Program.

WABASH VALLEY TEEN CHALLENGE

A program of Indiana Teen Challenge, Wabash Valley Teen Challenge is a faith-based residential approach to drug and alcohol recovery. The center admits males age 18+ who are ready and willing to make a complete change in lifestyle. It is privately funded and subsidizes all students through individual, corporate and church donations. This year, Wabash Valley Teen Challenge sought a grant for tools and equipment in support of its General Work Experience Program, a work-related activity that helps students achieve identity, self-esteem and self-confidence for the future. The program was awarded an \$8,000 Community Foundation grant from the Felstein Grandchildren Fund in Memory of Allen & Millie Felstein.

EARN WHILE YOU LEARN

The Crisis Pregnancy Center of the Wabash Valley not only provides pregnancy counseling and services; it also offers educational programs that help teens—both moms and dads—become better parents. Parenting instructors with the Center's Earn While You Learn program help them understand the challenges and joys of parenthood. The "earn" part of the program lets participants earn Baby Bucks by showing up for appointments, watching videos and doing homework on topics of their choice. Baby Bucks are then used to "buy" needed items like maternity and baby clothes, blankets, diapers and formula. A \$6,560 grant from the Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Clay County is helping to expand the program to provide clients in Clay County with the needed materials and training to become proactive parents and citizens.






