2016 WAS AN EXTRAORDINARY YEAR FOR THE WABASH VALLEY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION. I HAVE COMPLETED MY FOURTH AND FINAL YEAR AS PRESIDENT OF THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION. ALL OF THEM HAVE BEEN GOOD, BUT THIS ONE HAS BEEN THE BEST.

First and foremost, you, the citizens of Clay, Sullivan and Vigo Counties, stepped up to the challenge of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT VI initiative, an unexpected challenge grant which enriched our resources by \$2 million. Along with other gifts and a successful investment year, the success of this challenge moved our asset base to record \$49,565,515. All board members stepped up both monetarily and by their leadership. And you stepped up, as well.

What does this mean? Well, it means the Community Foundation will have more to invest in scholarships and in grants to community projects. This year, we approved over \$533,330 in scholarships and \$1,005,932 in grants. Those projects and scholarships are listed in this annual report. It is an impressive list, and I hope you take the time to review it. Next year, and forever, our larger endowment base will yield more income, if history is a guide.

Along with other Hoosiers, we celebrated the bicentennial of our state, and our Bicentennial Legacy Project was a new headquarters to serve the Wabash Valley for the next century. After

23 years of renting, we decided to invest in our own property, adapting a mid-century modern building to provide office space for us and meeting space for the community. We now have an effective, energy efficient community headquarters to better serve the Wabash Valley.

You support us, and you expect us to be responsible stewards of the Community Foundation. To assure that, we went through the rigorous process of applying for and successfully receiving accreditation from National Standards for U.S. Community Foundations, certifying that the Community Foundation does indeed meet the highest standards for philanthropic excellence. This is assurance to you that your money is being managed well and expended in accordance with your wishes.

During the last four years, we have worked hard to expand our staff to meet your expectations of a professional and responsible organization. We have always been blessed with good people doing good work. Now, as the demands are greater, we have a fully equipped staff prepared to meet those challenges.

We are also blessed with a wonderful set of volunteers for our board and committees. Our board is committed to continued improvements as the Community Foundation grows. We continue to review ways we can utilize our reserves to strengthen our communities. Our committees have

carried out their stewardship roles by conducting an arduous Request for Proposals process for both a marketing firm and an investment consultant.

Much of what I have talked about in this letter is beyond the normal routine of the Community Foundation, which of course is our most important task. The Community Foundation exists to give you the opportunity of helping our communities by contributing toward permanent funding of scholarships and projects that will carry out your wishes For good. For ever.®

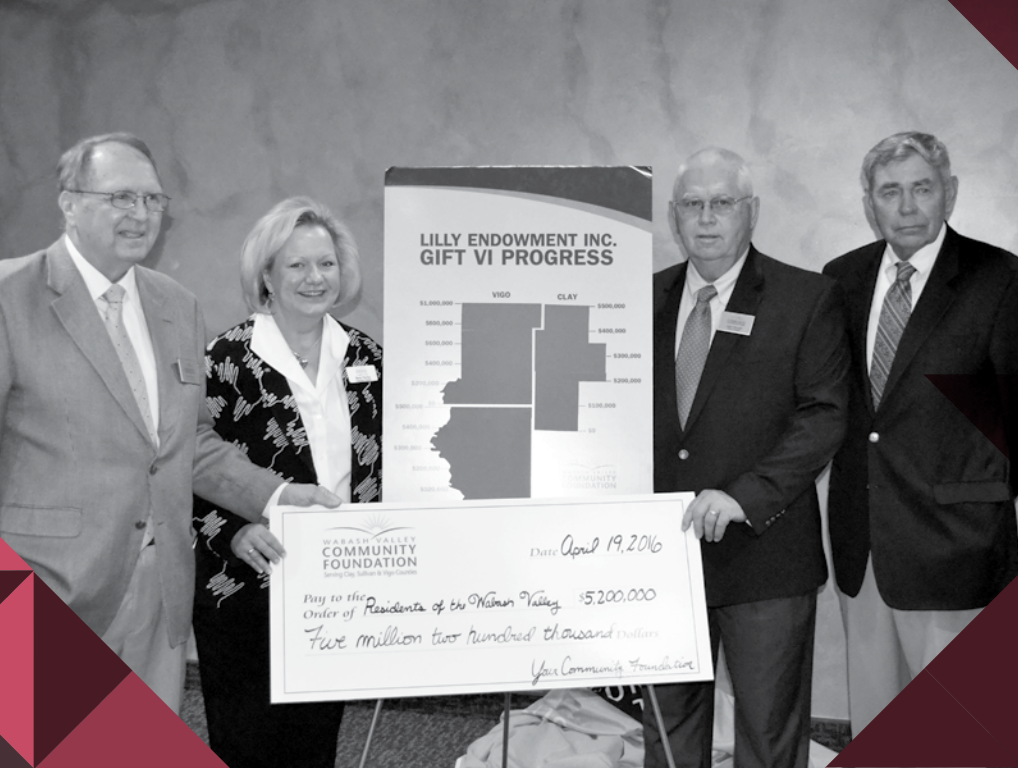

LILLY ENDOWMENT INC. GIFT VI CHALLENGE

AUGUST 1, 2014 - MARCH 31, 2016

A \$5.2 MILLION DOLLAR DIFFERENCE

In August 2014, Lilly Endowment Inc. launched the GIFT (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow) VI initiative, a statewide challenge to community foundations. With a distribution goal of \$66 million, the Endowment's grant initiative offered incentives that included a \$1-for-\$1 match. This matching challenge specifically focused on building community endowments that were unrestricted and would have the greatest flexibility to respond to local opportunities within the communities.

The Endowment's match varied in amounts from \$500,000 to \$2 million, depending on the population of the county. The Wabash Valley Community Foundation was eligible for \$2 million provided we met our match challenge by March 31, 2016. Once met, the challenge grant would yield matches of \$500,000 in Clay County, \$500,000 in Sullivan County and \$1 million in Vigo County.

Fred Nation, president of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation, said the challenge opportunity came during a time when there was continued uncertainty in the market. "Many thought it would be incredibly hard to [meet the challenge]," he said. "While it is never an easy time to raise money, I think the Wabash Valley is special. We have citizens who believe in the future of our communities and hope for a better future and are willing to invest in it."

The citizens of the Wabash Valley certainly stepped up to the challenge in order to make a difference in our communities. In the span of 20 months,

the Community Foundation raised a total of \$3.2 million in new endowment funds of all types. This amount fully leveraged the \$2 million from Lilly Endowment, resulting in a total of \$5.2 million added to the permanent community capital for the Wabash Valley.

The funds, which have since been invested, will grow over time and create a greater impact year after year.

"Completion of these challenge grants will provide more funding for grants within the communities," said Beth Tevlin, executive director of the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. "By our 2018 fiscal year, the full amount of the unrestricted gifts and the Lilly Endowment challenge grants will be providing additional and recurring community capital to fund worthwhile programs and projects."

Larry Tempel, president of the Clay County Community Foundation, expressed enthusiasm for seeing how the additional funds will transform his community.

"We're thrilled to see the difference that the increase in funding will make in Clay County," he said. "Thanks to the generosity [we received], we expect to award \$70,000 per year compared to the roughly \$30,000 we've been able to award in the past."

The additional funding has also inspired our volunteers to seek out additional ways that the Community Foundation can continue to make a difference in the Wabash Valley.

"This process has allowed our board to have discussions about the future of our county," explained Howard Unger, former Asset Development Committee chairman for the Sullivan County Community Foundation. "We have looked at the current state of our county and have begun to dream about the difference we can make with the increase in funding opportunities GIFT VI has provided!"

This success would not have been possible without the generosity of those who believe in the future of our communities and are willing to make a difference. To all of our contributors, board members and volunteers, thank you for making a difference For good. For ever.®

THE IMPACT OF GIFT VI AND OUR COMMUNITY FUNDS

A desire to make a difference is precisely what prompted the Wabash Valley Community Foundation board to engage in discussions pertaining to our Vigo County grant guidelines. With the successful completion of GIFT VI, we expect to have additional unrestricted funding for our community grant process by our 2018 Fiscal Year; however, preparations were necessary to ensure that the contributions received during GIFT VI will be used forever to achieve a lasting, positive impact in our communities.

“We want to invest [your] contributions in projects that are going to create the greatest return in bringing about positive changes that impact our communities,” said Kelli Miller, program director for the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. “We look at grants as investments that are being made in partnership with community agencies and organizations. With this mindset, we can create a partnership to focus on investing in solutions that, over time, will lessen and eliminate chronic problems.”

As a result of the discussions, the Community Foundation board implemented new grant guidelines for Vigo County with new guidelines also being discussed for Clay and Sullivan counties.

There are now two types of funding by which a nonprofit agency can apply: Impact Grants and Urgent Need Grants.

IMPACT GRANT FUNDING ranges from \$2,000 to \$25,000. Impact Grants allow the Community Foundation to invest in projects and programs that result in measurable and lasting positive outcomes. We value collaborative efforts, organizational commitment and the ability to benefit a large segment of the community. Impact Grant funding should demonstrate how the grant will enhance community development, image and livability or how it empowers those with the capacity to do for themselves.

URGENT NEED FUNDING of up to \$2,000 is available to address sudden, unanticipated and unavoidable needs of a nonprofit organization. Through an expedited process, funding may be available within 10 business days from the submission of the application.

You helped make a difference during GIFT VI, and we want to ensure your dollars will continue to make a difference now and in the years to come. We are confident that these changes will result in agencies within our community developing impactful and visionary programs and projects that will serve as lasting investments in the quality of life in our community.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN THE WABASH VALLEY

In our 2016 Fiscal Year, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation and our affiliates, Clay County Community Foundation and Sullivan County Community Foundation, awarded nearly \$1.6 million in grants and scholarships. Of that amount, over \$342,000 was funded through our unrestricted grant process. The way we look at it, that is \$342,000 for projects, programs and opportunities such as a new inpatient hospice care facility, interior restoration of a community theatre, children's books, training resources for parent education and food vouchers for healthy eating programs – all made possible thanks to the generosity of individuals wanting to make a difference in the lives of citizens in their communities.

Whether individuals choose to give through the Community Foundation, serve as a member of a Giving Circle such as 100 Women Who Care or Guys Who Give, or volunteer their time and talent to the Community Foundation or through other organizations, one thing is for certain: Wabash Valley residents are dedicated to making a difference and supporting the organizations they care about.

CLAY COUNTY

CHILD-ADULT RESOURCE SERVICES, INC.

Child-Adult Resource Services, Inc. (C.A.R.S.), is a private not-for-profit agency dedicated to providing services for children, families and adults who have a variety of support, education and rehabilitation needs. Since 1969, C.A.R.S. has provided several noteworthy projects and services in Indiana and East Central Illinois, some of which include Head Start, Healthy Families and, most recently, the Beyond I Can project.

Beyond I Can provides art programs to create better quality of life for persons with disabilities. This project allows individuals the opportunity to create, inspire and achieve a sense of ownership over self-motivated art designs. Those currently enrolled in the program have experienced growth through self-advocacy, improved quality of life through social interactions, as well as an enhanced learning environment using clay as a source of informal therapy for physical mobility limitations and coping skills for an outlet for emotional stress.

Though working with clay is one of the more popular activities for the individuals enrolled, oftentimes projects are set to the side for several months due to the inability to fire the artwork in a kiln. In the past, many area businesses have volunteered utilization of their kilns for said projects; however, the businesses do not always have the time or the space to consistently fire the work.

To assist with the purchase of a kiln, Clay County Community Foundation awarded a \$4,500 grant from the Clay County Community Grant Fund, Clay City Lions Community Fund, Randy and Cathy Collins Endowment Fund, Paul and Rita Harden Family Fund, Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Clay County, Lilly Endowment Fund for Clay County and Brazil Rotary Community Fund. With these funds, participants of Beyond I Can will have a finished product to promote within their community with focus on their abilities as opposed to their disabilities.

ANNUNCIATION ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Brazil Conference began in 2013 with a handful of individuals who recognized a need in the community to assist those who were less fortunate. During its startup phase, the Conference provided services to approximately 20 families per month; today, it serves over 2,000 families per year.



In continuing its service of helping families, St. Vincent de Paul Brazil has shifted its main focus beyond the necessity of providing food, clothing and shelter to alleviating immediate needs. "Our goal is to engage in the identification of the root causes of poverty and create strategies [to] change those structures," explained Natalie Shonk, conference president for Annunciation St. Vincent de Paul. "We will help families make significant improvement for themselves and our community."

To help achieve this goal, Clay County Community Foundation provided a \$1,225 grant for a professional, national St. Vincent de Paul mentoring program called "Changing Lives Forever." This program provides education and skill development, supportive relationships, social and professional connections, spiritual growth and community engagement for individuals in Clay County. The first priority of the program is moving beyond a home visit that focuses on solving an immediate problem, such as food or paying a bill, to building an ongoing relationship with participants that will help them move out of poverty. This 16-week program utilizes materials to educate clients on the rules of work and other skills needed to become economically self-sufficient. A difference is made by significantly transforming the lives of those who participate.

The \$1,225 grant for the program came from the Guy & Anne Tribble Family Fund, John E. and Karen E. Mercer Family Endowment Fund, Norman and Carolyn Keiser Family Endowment Fund, Albert and Freda Eder DeCoursey Community Fund and Clay County Community Grant Fund.

CLAY CITY SENIOR CITIZENS HOUSING, INC.

Clay City Senior Citizens Housing, Inc. is a nonprofit program with a mission to provide affordable housing for senior citizens and the disabled, as well as to provide a safe and caring place for residents to call home.



In 2012, the residents of Clay City Senior Citizens Housing developed a social committee in an effort to create a neighborly environment. This committee was tasked with planning social events that would allow participation not only from fellow residents, but also from residents in the Clay City community. The various activities such as ice cream socials, luaus, ham-and-bean suppers, euchre club and game night have been well received and have positively impacted the residents. Many report the gatherings make a difference in their emotional well-being by allowing them to establish friendships and keep their minds active. These social opportunities are critical as loneliness and isolation are addressed, which are major challenges facing many seniors and disabled people.

As many of the residents do not own cars, or due to mobility restrictions have a difficult time getting in and/or out of cars, the events are generally housed in the community room. Unfortunately, the room itself was in dire need of an upgrade.

“The room’s furniture [was] a collection of used items, either donated or purchased by funds raised by the social committee,” said Becky Malone, Senior Housing board member. “The pieces [were] looking quite worn and had sagging seats which made it difficult for our seniors to get up out of them.”

With a \$2,850 grant from the Traci K. Miller Memorial Fund, Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Clay, Clay County Community Grant Fund and Lilly Endowment Fund for Clay County, the Clay City Senior Citizens Housing was able to purchase a couch specifically constructed for seniors. The funds also allowed for the reupholstering of three sturdy chairs, as well as for the purchase of 12 dining room chairs and a gently used dining room table.

SULLIVAN COUNTY

SULLIVAN COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Sullivan County Historical Society (SCHS) was formed in 1974 to preserve, promote and showcase the history of Sullivan County. In 1984, board members of the SCHS purchased the old Bennett's Drug store on the courthouse square in order to create a museum for Sullivan County's history. Over the years and as funding has become available, the 133-year-old building has undergone significant restorations which include a new roof, new boiler and AC unit, new ceilings, and brickwork stabilization to the east and north sides of the building.

Nearly two years ago, the SCHS undertook one final restoration project: the storefront. As the main entry to the museum, the storefront is frequently used and was in dire need of restoration. The plan was to restore the storefront to reflect the look of the 1900s era, which would generate interest and increase attendance to the museum. In addition, the complete restoration could serve as an example and encourage other building owners to make a difference by restoring their own buildings; thus halting the erosion of downtown Sullivan.

After receiving a \$4,000 grant from the Sullivan County Community Foundation, the SCHS was able to complete their storefront restoration with the purchase and installation of an awning on the front of the building.

The end result is a welcoming entryway for those coming to the museum to conduct research or other business, and an updated look to the historic district of downtown Sullivan.

The \$4,000 grant came from the Allomatic Products Community Enrichment Fund, Leo & Virginia Pellum Endowment Fund and Lilly Endowment Fund for Sullivan County.

FARMERSBURG INDIANA FRIENDS OF THE PARK ASSOCIATION



Farmersburg Indiana Friends of the Park Association exists to help provide clean, safe areas for recreational use for the residents of Farmersburg and the surrounding area. The Association is a volunteer organization comprised of four officers and 15 members, which relies solely on donations and grants for funding. These donations and grants help the Association with projects such as new construction, fresh playground mulch, park improvements and ongoing maintenance.

As a component of its ongoing park improvement project, the Association applied for and received funding to pave the remainder of the walking paths at the George Heap Memorial Park. Though there were white rock trails connecting various features of the park, the conversion to asphalt made the park more accessible for people with wheelchairs and walkers, or to people using strollers.

A \$2,500 grant to complete the pavement of the walking paths came from the Sullivan County Community Grant Fund and Black Beauty Sullivan County Community Fund. The freshly paved paths have allowed for greater access, which has resulted in more people utilizing and enjoying the amenities of George Heap Memorial Park.

SULLIVAN COUNTY AMERICAN INDIAN COUNCIL

The Sullivan County American Indian Council is an organization which operates under the belief that the past is our greatest teacher. In an effort to avoid allowing the past to slip away forever, the organization developed a public park to honor the indigenous people, both past and present, by protecting and preserving the pre-historic Indian Mounds in the area.

The Waapaahsiki Siippiwi Mound Historical Park, which opened in May of 2013, has become a popular historical destination and receives hundreds of visitors each year. In late April 2016, nearly 100 children from a local

elementary school attended an educational program for a day filled with storytelling, demonstrations, wood carving and dancing to the songs of drummers. The following week, the organization hosted its annual Celebration of the Future Pow Wow and welcomed over 500 visitors to the historical landscape.



As Indiana weather is quite unpredictable, the Sullivan County American Indian Council sought to construct a shelter near the heritage gardens. A shelter house would offer a place of comfort for the elderly and disabled to rest as they enjoy the heritage gardens and nature's blessings, and would allow other special interest groups such as the elementary students to gather during inclement weather.

In order to construct the shelter, friends and volunteers of the park donated excess materials such as bolts and screws, as well as recycled wood and rafters from an old barn. Additionally, a local excavator made a donation of time and equipment to move some trees and dig the foundation for the shelter. For the tin roof, the Sullivan County Community Foundation awarded a \$1,000 grant from Allomatic Products Community Enrichment Fund, Black Beauty Sullivan County Community Fund, Sullivan County Community Grant Fund and William Ferd and Connie Pleasant Johnson Memorial Fund. Together, the community made a difference and created a space to bring cultural awareness of the American Indian to the people of Sullivan County.

VIGO COUNTY

WEST VIGO COMMUNITY CENTER

The West Vigo Community Center is a non-profit United Way Agency that has served the area for over 30 years. Housed in the old Valley High School Gymnasium, the Community Center is overseen by a Board of Directors who donate countless hours to keep the center active and contributing to the community. As the only facility of its kind in the West Terre Haute area, the Community Center offers senior citizen activities, youth sports activities, outreach programs, community socialization activities and has the ability to serve as a shelter in times of flooding or other natural disasters.

Given the high volume of activity at the Community Center, it is only natural that the 83-year-old building require significant upkeep. One such task was to replace all 10 of the single-pane windows in the gymnasium. The windows, which were over 40 years old, would easily break and would allow heat to rapidly escape during the winter months – regardless of how often they were patched.

To assist the Community Center in the replacement, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation awarded a \$5,000 grant from the Carol M. Starkey Kochell Charitable Fund. Once installed, the new windows will potentially reduce operating costs while providing a suitable, environmentally controlled area for community members.

VIGO COUNTY CASA KIDS

Established in 1985, Vigo County CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) provides specially selected and trained community volunteers to advocate for and represent abused and neglected children within the juvenile court system in the pursuit of a safe and permanent home. Advocates are appointed by a judge or magistrate to serve the children entering the child welfare system due to neglect and/or abuse by their caregivers. CASA volunteers become the voice of the child, speaking up for the best interest of that child throughout the juvenile court proceedings. The CASA volunteer also becomes the eyes and ears for the judge in ensuring that each child's wishes and needs are placed before the judge through reports and testimony in the courtroom.

In 2016, Vigo County CASA found itself in need of funding for its Kids Waitlist Reduction Project. As Indiana courts have mandated that every child who becomes a ward of the court have a CASA appointed to represent them, the Kids Waitlist had up to 170 kids

waiting for CASA to be their voice. In order to reduce the amount of time kids are left waiting for an advocate, Director Nikki Fuhrmeister, in collaboration with the Vigo County Juvenile Magistrate, Daniel Kelly, created the Kids Waitlist Reduction Project. This project involves analyzing the severity of the cases, providing general oversight of the less severe cases and mentoring the volunteer CASAs.

A \$16,000 grant in support of the Kids Waitlist Reduction Project was funded through the Community Chest of Terre Haute Fund, Richard C. Vining Community Fund, Delmar L. and Betty L. Jones Family Fund and David and Luann Bolck Endowment Fund. Thanks to this grant, the number of kids waiting for an advocate was drastically reduced, thus providing reassurance to each child that each voice is important and will be heard.

CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT DOCUMENTARY, INC.

Vigo County has accurately picked the president in almost every election since 1888. Though it did not correctly predict the winning candidate in 1908 or 1952, this is still an impressive feat as none of the other 3,140 counties in the nation can come close to comparison.

For years, many have wondered what it is that gives Vigo County the uncanny ability to predict our next president. In the hopes of perhaps providing a definitive answer, media production group, 5BlindMen+1, LLC, created Bellwether 2016 – a digital documentary project tasked with studying how and why Vigo County reflects the American political outlook. Thanks to a sponsorship agreement with the Center for Independent Documentary, the group spent nearly 2 ½ years studying how Vigo County is, in many ways, representative of American experience and outlook more than any other U.S. community.


“Coming down 3rd Street, Terre Haute and Vigo County is like any other place in America: neither somewhere nor nowhere with grocery, hardware and gas stations,” explained Don Campbell, creative director of 5BlindMen+1 and director of Bellwether 2016. “Once Downtown Terre Haute looms on the horizon, it becomes something. [A] community at a different crossroads, one between hope and resignation, dedicated and devoted to strengthening what is here.”

Bellwether 2016, which is set for film release in November 2017, will focus on larger themes to reveal underlying conditions and sentiments of Terre Haute, as well as on people and stories that give viewers an intimate understanding of how life shapes individual outlook. To that end, the stories of Bellwether will not focus on the people who define the county, but on people

who are defined by Vigo County and Terre Haute. These are people who, through economic diversity, vocations, aspirations and activities, reflect a balance of America.

A \$5,000 grant to assist with the development of Bellwether 2016 came from the Vigo County Community Grant Fund. Once completed, the film will bring national awareness to the region as a reflection of national outlook and experience.

WAYS TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Your gift to the Community Foundation allows you to support the causes you care about most while making a difference in our communities. Giving to the Community Foundation is flexible in that you can donate to an existing fund or establish your own fund. You can also choose to make a donation to a Community Grant Fund in Clay, Sullivan or Vigo counties, allowing the Community Foundation to make grants that impact the lives of each county's citizens. Whichever option you select, be assured that your donation will be used as directed.

CASH is the easiest way to contribute, whether it is actual cash or a check. The Community Foundation's online giving platform, Wabash Valley Gives, is a convenient way to give using a credit or debit card.

APPRECIATED SECURITIES, when donated, allow you to avoid paying the capital gains tax on any appreciation in value while providing an accompanying income tax deduction for the current fair-market value.

IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER, which is now permanent, provides several benefits. If you are age 70½ and older, you may transfer up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the Community Foundation. You can specify the way your gift will be used to make a difference through projects and programs within the community, while paying no taxes on the transfer. You can also use the transfer to count against your IRA required minimum distribution (RMD). *Congress does not allow you to create a donor advised fund with an IRA Charitable Rollover.*

TRANSFERRING LIFE INSURANCE, with the Community Foundation named as the beneficiary and owner of an existing or new policy, allows you an immediate tax deduction, which usually approximates the cash surrender value of the policy.

PRIVATE FOUNDATIONS OR TRUSTS often require significant time and money to manage. By transferring your private foundation or charitable trust to the Community Foundation, all responsibilities for reports and administrative duties will be carried out by the staff of the Community Foundation, which allows you to focus on the charitable purpose. Since the Community Foundation is a public charity and does not pay excise tax, more income is available for charitable purposes.

A DEFERRED GIFT, made through your will or estate plan, will provide you the opportunity to support the Community Foundation in the future. The Community Foundation will work cooperatively with you and your financial planner, attorney or accountant to create an endowment that will ensure that your wishes are properly followed when the gift is ultimately received. The following are considered to be deferred gifts:

A testamentary gift, or bequest in your will, is one way you can create your charitable legacy.

A charitable remainder trust allows you or someone you choose to receive an income for life from assets transferred to a trust. Creating a charitable remainder trust also qualifies for a current charitable deduction, the amount of which is determined by the age of the income recipient and the payout rate. When the trust ends, the trust remainder is placed in a permanent fund in your name in the Community Foundation, with the charitable distributions made in accordance with your wishes.

A charitable gift annuity is a simple way to make a substantial gift while retaining the right to a fixed annual income for life. Once the income is no longer paid, the remainder supports the charitable cause you have selected.

A charitable lead trust allows the Community Foundation to receive an annual payment during your lifetime or for a specified number of years. When the trust terminates, the principal is returned to you or others you have designated.

REAL ESTATE OR PERSONAL PROPERTY may be given to the Community Foundation. Of course, all gifts qualify for a charitable tax deduction in the year the gift was made in accordance with IRS rules.

Acknowledgment

All individuals giving to the Community Foundation are acknowledged for their gift, regardless of size. Should an individual prefer anonymity, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation protects the identity and confidentiality of the individual.

UNRESTRICTED ENDOWMENT FUNDS

If you wish to support new and existing programs and projects that impact the residents of your county, unrestricted endowments, also called community grant funds, are for you. Local county volunteers, knowledgeable about the community, carefully review how these funds can best be used.

FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS

Perhaps you have a particular interest in a specific field or opportunity. It might be the arts, education or improved services such as health, recreation or fire protection. The Community Foundation Board will award grants from your fund within the area you have set forth in your fund agreement.

ADVISED FUNDS

You may wish to have more involvement in the annual distributions from your fund. By choosing an advised fund, you may recommend or specify who will recommend grant opportunities from your fund. Each year, a different charitable grantee can be recommended.

DESIGNATED FUNDS

If you are devoted to one or more charitable organizations, you may wish to establish a designated fund, thereby ensuring that your favorite charity or charities will receive annual grants from your endowed resources.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS

An agency may establish an agency endowment fund for its benefit. The agency's supporters may contribute anytime and in any amount to ensure an uninterrupted and dependable source of annual revenue to carry out the work of the agency.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

A scholarship fund will assist students with tuition and fees to pursue a post-secondary education. A scholarship fund can benefit worthy students from the county of your choice or can be customized to incorporate your preferences for a particular field of study or a particular institution of higher education. Eligibility of applicants, application procedures and the amount and duration of scholarship support are designed to reflect your wishes.

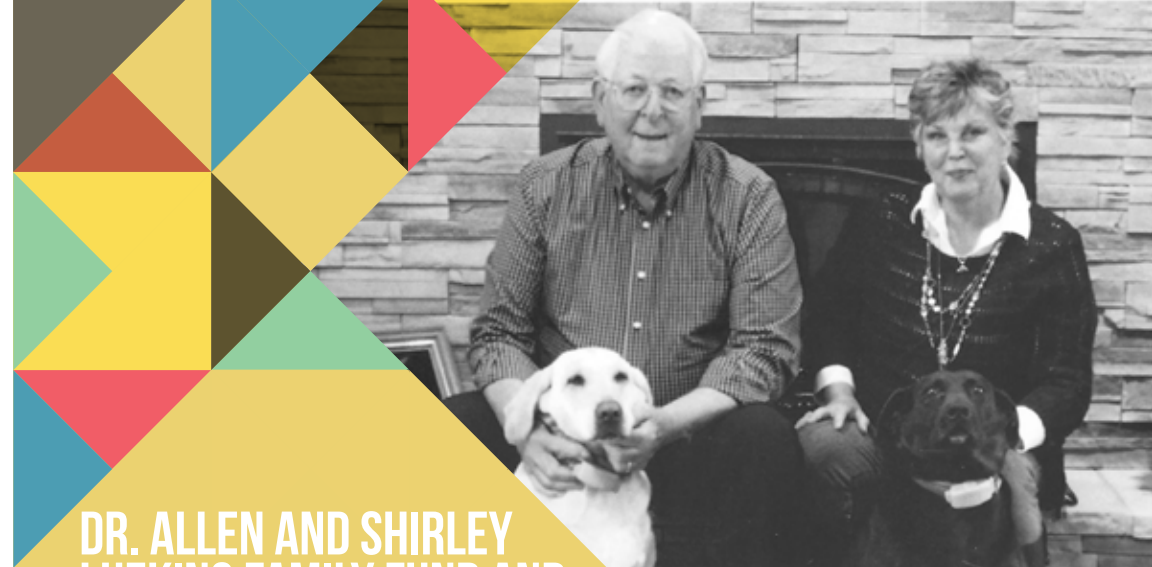

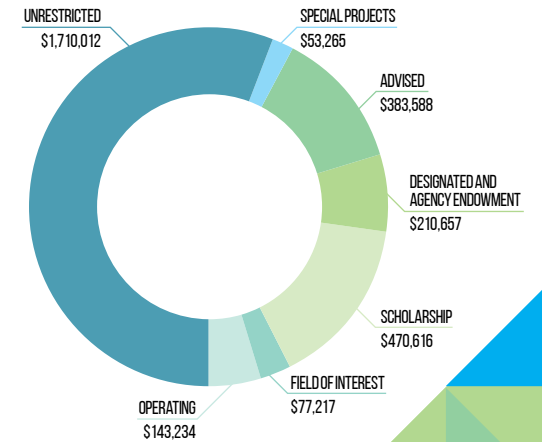
