th anniversary grant program

In 2017, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation celebrated 25 years of service. We are fortunate to have spent this past quarter century guiding the charitable efforts of community-minded individuals, as well as partnering with nonprofit agencies focused on improving the quality of life within our communities.

The past 25 years of achievement is due to the great generosity of individuals, families and corporate donors. The gifts given to the Community Foundation were added to permanent and lasting endowment funds that have benefitted the community repeatedly in the past and will continue to do so in the future.

To celebrate this milestone and say thank you to the Wabash Valley, the Community Foundation awarded twenty-five \$1,000 anniversary grants weekly beginning July 7, 2017. More than 100 applications were received from nonprofit agencies in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties detailing how a gift of \$1,000 could make a significant impact on those they serve. This 25-week endeavor benefitted youth, seniors, arts & culture, animals, environment, historical preservation and community improvements.

Grants of \$1,000 each were awarded to the following nonprofit organizations:

BRAZIL MAIN STREET secured a projector and sound equipment in order to show movies outdoors during the summer months.

CAMP WABASHI used the gift to make the necessary repairs to a failing ice machine.

CITY OF SULLIVAN PARK purchased two dozen stackable chaise lounge chairs for use around the pool.

FIRST FRIENDS PRESCHOOL replaced five 25-year-old play kitchens.

WHITE VIOLET CENTER FOR ECO-JUSTICE purchased a 3-bay sink for its commercial kitchen.

CENTER POINT & COMMUNITY

VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY replaced
30-year-old tables and chairs frequently
used in fundraisers and at community
events.

TERRE HAUTE WOMEN'S CLUB purchased wide-size shoes for kids in grades K-12.

OUABACHE LAND CONSERVANCY developed and improved the trail system at the Jackson-Schnyder Nature Preserve.

SULLIVAN COUNTY AMERICAN INDIAN COUNCIL, INC. purchased solar panel kits and several LED lights to provide overhead lighting in the shelter house at Waapaahsiki Siipiiwi Mound.

VIGO COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY
digitized 2,000 feet of 16mm film of
1960s high school sporting events from
Schulte Garfield Wiley Gerstmeyer

Schulte, Garfield, Wiley, Gerstmeyer, Honey Creek and West Vigo.

WESTERN INDIANA COMMUNITY

ACTION AGENCY purchased two new computers for the computer lab for clients and families to have access to additional services offered by the organization, as well as to resources available on the internet.

KIDDIN AROUND GOAT CLUB purchased the electrical and lighting supplies needed for the goat barn expansion, and a show dryer for club use.

COMMUNITY THEATRE OF TERRE
HAUTE put the \$1,000 grant toward
renovations of the 20-year-old concession
area which had deteriorated from
continued use.

BROWNSTONE MANOR purchased a chest freezer for food donation storage, two patio umbrellas, bug lights and outside games to benefit residents.

RURAL COMMUNITY ACADEMY purchased new books for the library to introduce new authors to grades K-8.

WABASH VALLEY HEALTH CENTER obtained a capsule mixer, denture model shaker and denture model holder for the dental clinic.

CLAY COUNTY PARKS ASSOCIATION used the grant to purchase a piece of

playground equipment for Craig Park in Brazil, Indiana.

THE SALVATION ARMY revitalized the landscaping on the exterior of the building on South 8th Street side.

LAUNCH TERRE HAUTE purchased podcast equipment and created a podcast studio for the organization and members of the business community.

HUMANE SOCIETY OF SULLIVAN
COUNTY secured an endless hot water
heater for the facility.

THE WILL CENTER purchased lighting devices and bulbs for elderly, low-income consumers.

CLAY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY installed an interurban rail at Bicentennial Legacy Park.

WABASH RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND BEAUTIFICATION (RIVERSCAPE) purchased materials for West Vigo students to design and build a bicycle rack at Dewey Point.

MEROM CAMP & RETREAT CENTER used the grant to purchase new audio visual equipment to replace equipment from the 1940s.

SHELDON SWOPE ART MUSEUM, INC. purchased an additional freestanding room divider which will be used during the Annual Student Art Exhibition to display the work of elementary artists.

A Foundation for the Wabash Valley

The Wabash Valley Community Foundation and our affiliates, Clay County Community Foundation and Sullivan County Community Foundation, were formed because community-minded individuals had a vision for the Wabash Valley and worked diligently to make that vision a reality. These individuals saw opportunities for Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties and wanted to create an organization that would help support projects and programs within these communities and benefit the lives of generations to come.

For a quarter-century, nonprofit organizations such as the ones listed on the following pages have received grants through the Community Foundation thanks to the generosity of those who believe in growing a better future for our communities. These nonprofit organizations exemplify the mission of the Community Foundation in that they work to engage people, build resources and strengthen community through various projects and programs.

Engage people

Friends of Seelyville, Inc.

In 2006, the Friends of Seelyville, Inc. was organized to help commemorate the Town of Seelyville's 100th birthday. Tasked with developing and improving the Town of Seelyville and Lost Creek, the Friends raise money for their own projects and work to promote awareness of other projects, programs and activities that make the areas more attractive to current and future residents.

As one of their ongoing projects is to develop the Anna M. Dickerson Park, the Friends have spent several years raising money to purchase new equipment, place sidewalks and have installed a basketball goal and two picnic shelters donated by the Township Trustee; however, they have been unable to add a water fountain or permanent restroom to the Park. The Friends

felt a permanent, all-weather facility and drinking fountain would increase usage of the Park by drawing members of the community to the Park year-round.

To help provide a permanent all-weather restroom to the Anna M. Dickerson Park, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation awarded a \$12,000 grant from the Delmar L. and Betty L. Jones Family Fund, Thelma Maxine Dever Memorial Fund, Vigo County Community Grant Fund, White Family Endowment Fund, Carl W. ("Bang") and Josephine M. Price Memorial, Wabash Valley Pharmaceutical Society Fund – Vigo County, Lukens Family Endowment Fund and Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund.

Union Health Foundation

The Union Health Foundation was formed in May 1985 to develop and steward charitable support for the benefit of the patients of Union Hospital. Its Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), the first in the State of Indiana, is a 15-bed, Level III unit and the largest within a 70-mile radius. The number of babies admitted to the NICU, including transfers from surrounding hospitals in the area, continues to increase. This increase brings a growing need for assistance for families in need while they cope with a critical family experience.

About 10 years ago, Union's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Family Assistance Program was started thanks to a \$5,000 grant from the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. This program allows qualified families identified through Union Hospital's Social Service Department to receive assistance

with transportation costs via gas cards, specialized car seats, meal tickets and breast pump rentals. By helping to reduce the stress on families with babies in the NICU, the program helps nurture and encourage parent/child bonding during this difficult time.

As this program continues to grow in both need and impact, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Curt & Linda Brighton Family Endowment Fund, 100 Women Who Care Endowment Fund, James R. Piker, Ada A. Piker and Virginia M. Ginter Memorial Fund and Leon & Roberta Sackrider Endowment Fund to continue to help support the program as well as families with children in the NICII.

Clay County Indiana Council on Aged & Aging



The Clay County Indiana Council on Aged & Aging was formed in 1974 to provide senior citizens a place to meet, have nutritious meals and partake in recreation. With a goal of enhancing the life of seniors, Clay County Senior Center staff members offer socialization with peers and activities

that strengthen their mental and physical health. Many of the seniors do not have family; the Center often serves as their only source for assistance and companionship.

To make the Center a safer, more enjoyable place for seniors to gather, staff members have spent the past few years making necessary updates to the building. The windows were recently upgraded to help reduce heating costs; however, Center officials determined they could save an additional 50-75% by adding a new electrical panel and LED lights. Not only would the Center see a reduction in expenses, but the upgrade in lighting would also result in more seniors utilizing the building and engaging in activities.

A \$5,170 grant from the Clay County Community Foundation to install a new electrical panel was provided by the Traci K. Miller Memorial Fund, Herschel and Josephine Morge Endowment Fund, Clay Civic Memorial Foundation Community Fund, Richard and Hila Zimmerman Endowment Fund and Larry & Martha Tempel Family Community Fund.

Friends of Historic Allen Chapel



The Friends of Historic Allen Chapel is a Terre Haute community volunteer organization formed to work toward the preservation of the Allen Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church. The building, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, is unparalleled in its historic importance to early Terre Haute and to Terre Haute's black heritage.

In an effort to prevent the landmark from becoming damaged beyond repair from the elements, the Friends of Historic Allen Chapel organized as a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) historic preservation council. The group is dedicated to preserving the building and is composed of community volunteers and leaders from Allen Chapel.

Working under the guidance of Indiana Landmarks, the Friends have spent 20 years raising funds, securing grants and sponsoring each step of the restoration, which is near completion. Allen Chapel has undergone seven phases of restoration including architectural evaluation, roof repairs, re-pointing of brick and masonry, replacement of electrical and heating-cooling systems, new kitchen and restroom, exterior repairs, insulation, restoration of the lighted altar cross, window and stained glass window restoration, pew restoration and the necessary accessibility adaptations. Phase VII, the final phase toward the completion of the restoration, includes interior restoration of the Historic Allen Chapel sanctuary and bell towers including tin ceilings, plaster walls and wood floors, stairways, doors, trim and decorative altar features.

A \$21,800 grant in support of completing Phase VII came from the Lilly Endowment Fund, Hulman George Family Endowment Fund, Wabash Valley Asphalt Endowment Fund, Delmar L. and Betty L. Jones Family Fund and PMC Fund. Upon completion, the church and fellowship hall will welcome all members of the congregation, school groups and Terre Haute area community groups that wish to use or visit the church.

Build Resources

Carlisle Lions Community Ambulance Service, Inc.

The Carlisle Lions Community Ambulance Service, Inc., also known as Carlisle Ambulance Service, was established as a nonprofit, volunteer organization on September 23, 1974. The Service exists not to make a profit, but to save lives and help anyone in and around Sullivan County requiring medical attention.

The Service desperately needed funding for infant and child car seats. The seats, which are designed specifically for ambulances and mandated by the state Emergency Medical Services, were too expensive for the Service to purchase out of pocket. This resulted in volunteers removing a child's car seat from an accident and buckling the child into the ambulance to legally transport him or her to the nearest hospital, or even using the child's family vehicle for transportation.

In addition to the infant and child car seats, the Service was in need of a Stryker stair chair for each ambulance. As cots often do not make sharp turns in hallways and are difficult to utilize in stairwells, the stair chair would alleviate those issues and would allow volunteers to transport patients smoothly and comfortably.

To allow the Carlisle Ambulance Service to purchase the necessary ambulance equipment, the Sullivan County Community Foundation awarded a \$6,604.30 grant from Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Sullivan County, Unger Family Fund and William and Joanne Wright Family Endowment Fund.

Northeast North Elementary

Northeast North Elementary School (NENE) believes students are entitled to an education commensurate with their abilities and aspirations. With a mission to provide all students with an appropriate education, the staff at NENE continually seek new methods for instructing students to maximize their potential while instilling a desire for lifelong learning.

Last year, the Sullivan County Community Foundation received a grant request from NENE to help provide its students with additional resources for STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education. The NENE proposed redesigning a classroom into a STEM lab that would offer a student-centered learning environment where students could engage in questioning, problem-solving, collaboration and hands-on activities during class time, recess, ENCORE and after school.

In addition to creating a STEM lab, NENE sought to provide each K-5 teacher an allotment for resources and hands-on materials that would extend and enrich math and science lessons. NENE staff also proposed hosting two STEM nights set up with various learning stations for families to experiment and learn.



To enable the purchase of STEM resources and significantly increase student excitement and achievement, the Community Foundation awarded an \$8,500 grant from William and Joanne Wright Family Endowment Fund, Lois A. Andrews Foundation Fund for Sullivan County, Sullivan Business and Professional Women's Club Endowment Fund and Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Sullivan County.

Chances and Services for Youth



Chances and Services for Youth, Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) program has been actively serving children of the Wabash Valley since 1964 and has provided programming for Clay County for the past 10 years. Mentors encourage children to reach their full potential through a one-on-one mentoring program with measurable impact. This bonding is accomplished through homework help, games and sharing about their days. Program mentors and children are provided with hands-on projects that allow for relationship growth, as well as a snack that encourages health and wellness.

In early 2017, BBBS in Clay County served three elementary schools and one high school, resulting in approximately 130 youth served. The BBBS staff and advisory council members met with Clay City Elementary School's principal and confirmed a need and desire for a site-based mentoring program. This desired program would expand to Clay City Elementary and Clay City Junior/Senior High School, with the potential of serving approximately 200 youth.

To help expand the site-based program to the remaining elementary schools in Clay County, as well as form a partnership with Clay City Junior/Senior High School, the Clay County Community Foundation awarded a \$10,000 matching grant provided by the Rolene Moore Fund, Steve and Michelle Bell Fund, Clyde and Kathryn Bullerdick Memorial Fund, Clay City Lions Community Fund and Clay Civic Memorial Foundation Community Fund.

Catholic Charities Terre Haute

Bethany House Emergency Shelter is a program of Catholic Charities, which is a comprehensive, direct services agency. Its primary mission is to serve the poor, the homeless, the elderly, the neglected children and the needy. It develops and administers programs in cooperation with parishes or any established group that desires to share in the Church's work of social ministry.

As a way to provide resources at the shelter that resemble a typical home environment and encourage a family dynamic, the residents' kitchen at the Bethany House includes standard appliances for safe food storage, preparation and servicing. Unfortunately, due to the high degree of usage and the quality

of appliances, both the oven and refrigerator in the residents' kitchen were in need of repair or replacement. The freezer door on the refrigerator and freezer was broken, which meant residents did not have a place to safely store their frozen foods or medication. The heating coil in the oven no longer functioned, which meant families were not able to create family dinners. Given the age and current condition of the units, repairs would cost more than half the price of newer units.

To assist the Bethany House in purchasing a 27.5 cubic foot refrigerator/freezer and 4.8 cubic foot electric oven/range, the Community Foundation awarded a \$1,576 grant from the Community Chest of Terre Haute Fund.

Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology



Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology (RHIT) is a fully accredited, nationally recognized, undergraduate-focused engineering, science and mathematics college located in the Wabash Valley. The Institute's Home for Environmentally Responsible Engineering (HERE) Program was founded in 2011 to provide a living-learning experience for first-year students who want to learn more about sustainability in engineering and science.

The HERE Program recently created a free afterschool program at Benjamin Franklin Elementary School called Ryves Up!, which is available to approximately 20 elementary school students. Ryves Up! has a threefold purpose: (1) to promote sustainability, (2) to create healthy living opportunities for students and their families, and (3) to help kids explore careers in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics). Along with volunteers and the program director, one Benjamin Franklin teacher and two RHIT interns spend two hours twice per week for 35 weeks mentoring and teaching students grades K-5.

A \$12,500 grant to help provide the resources needed to launch the HERE Program came from Bentrup Family Endowment Fund, Thomas and Susan Dinkel Family Endowment Fund, Janice and Vern Fellows Endowment Fund, Guys Who Give Community Fund, Ray G. Ingram Endowment Fund, Delmar L. and Betty L. Jones Family Fund and Alpa Patel and Thomas Yeagley Community Fund.

Strengthen Community

Poland Community Lions Club



The Poland Community Lions Club was formed in 2008 to service this small town in Clay County. Through countless hours of volunteer work, Club members strive to provide safe and fun social opportunities for citizens with events such as Trunk-or-Treat night, Easter egg hunt, Breakfast with Santa and the Poland Days summer celebration. The Club also supports vision screenings for local children, roadside cleanup for the highway, maintenance of the oldest cemetery in Cass Township, as well as park maintenance for the Lions Park located in the heart of Poland.

Several years ago, the Lions Club built a playground area in the park for children and their parents to use for safe and healthy recreation. Over time, the mulch installed under the playground equipment deteriorated; the wooden park benches broke and required replacement so that parents would have a seat from which to supervise their children; and the park became littered because trash receptacles weren't readily available.

As the town does not have a school, town hall or other recreational area, the Lions Park is of critical importance to the Poland community. Club members work hard to keep the park in good condition and the purchase of a mower and storage shed depleted the funds that would have otherwise been used to make the necessary repairs.

To help strengthen community involvement and assist with the needed repairs, the Clay County Community Foundation awarded a \$4,513 grant from Brazil Rotary Community Fund, Anna Ferrell Endowment Fund, Riddell National Bank – John H. Riddell Memorial, Richard and Hila Zimmerman Endowment Fund and L.T. and Janice K. Clark Family Endowment Fund.

Merom Improvement Association

The Merom Improvement Association was organized in 1966 in an effort to improve the Merom area and the lives of individuals living within the community. Early last year, members of the Association met with officials from the town of Merom, the Sullivan County Tourism Commission, as well as current and former residents to discuss a collaborative project that would enhance the community, offer educational value and bring visitors to the area.

Purchasing a section of land and constructing a wall, the group elected to develop a 15"x45" historical mural prior to the community's annual Chautauqua celebration held in early June. The mural, which now serves as the centerpiece of Merom, depicts the

first permanent county seat of Sullivan County, first co-educational college in the Midwest, history of the early ferry boat service across the river, Chautauqua from early 1900s, Merom Bluff Park and other notable references. To preserve the historical value and beauty of the mural, the group also applied an anti-graffiti paint so that generations may enjoy the project for years to come.

To assist with the mural completion, landscaping and sidewalks, the Sullivan County Community Foundation awarded a grant of \$6,000 from Lana Martindale Memorial Fund, Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Sullivan County, Lilly Endowment Fund for Sullivan County and Dr. Allen and Shirley Lueking Family Fund.

Heart of Sullivan and Carlisle Summer League

The Heart of Sullivan is the Indiana Main Street group of Sullivan, Indiana, working toward the goal of bringing citizens to the downtown area. In an effort to do so, the group has organized several events at the Civic Center and has invited downtown businesses to attend or participate. The group hopes to continue offering events in the area to strengthen community; however, there have been concerns of inadequate lighting outside the Civic Center.

In southern Sullivan County, the Carlisle Summer League also works toward strengthening community by providing organized teams for children of all ages from March through October. While baseball has been played in Carlisle for decades, the League itself was organized a mere 12 years ago with the help of 25 adult volunteers. Serving approximately 130 children each year, the League's facilities include two fields in Carlisle Town Park – of which only one had lighting. It was the League's desire to purchase and install lighting for the second field so that they can host more events, serve more children and provide additional resources for adult leagues looking for a place to play.

Heart of Sullivan and Carlisle Summer League share a common goal of bringing community together and providing resources to strengthen community, yet lack the necessary funds to do so. Accordingly, the Sullivan County Community Foundation provided partial grant funding to each organization in the amounts of \$8,600 and \$5,000, respectively.

The \$8,600 grant to support the installation of outdoor lighting at the Civic Center came from Lilly Endowment Fund for Sullivan County, John and Yvonne Longfield Endowment Fund, Sullivan County Community Grant Fund and Larry and Patti Mayfield Family Endowment Fund. For the lighting of the second ball field at Carlisle Town Park, the Community Foundation awarded a \$5,000 grant from Sullivan County Community Grant Fund, Lorene B. and Malcolm Pigg Endowment Fund, Harold and Malinda Medsker Endowment Fund and Lana Martindale Memorial Fund.

Dugger Lions Club, Inc.

The Dugger Lions Club, Inc. is a nonprofit organization dedicated to creating and fostering a spirit of understanding among all people for humanitarian needs by providing



services through community involvement and international service. Local programs and organizations currently served by Dugger Lions Club include the annual Eighth Grade Wabash River Expedition, mentorship of the Leo Club at the Dugger Charter School, vision screening and local fundraising efforts to support community services.

The building that houses the Dugger Lions Club recently underwent interior renovations and is available to the community for various functions. Unfortunately, the roof developed several leaks over the past year and required immediate replacement. To enable the Lions Club to continue its mission of offering services to the local community, the Sullivan County Community Foundation awarded a \$4,700 grant from Joe and Betty Dukes Family Endowment Fund and Lilly Endowment Board Designated Fund for Sullivan County.







gift to the Community Foundation allows you to support the causes you care about most while helping grow the permanent community capital for the future of the Wabash Valley. Giving to the Community Foundation is flexible in that you can give to an existing fund or establish your own. You can also choose to make a gift to

a Community Grant Fund for Clay, Sullivan or Vigo counties, allowing the Community Foundation to make grants that impact the lives of each county's citizens. Whichever option you select, be assured that your donation will be used as directed.

Cash is the easiest way to contribute, whether it is actual cash or a check. The Community Foundation's online giving platform, Wabash Valley Gives, is a convenient way to give by using a credit or debit card.

Appreciated securities, when donated, allow you to avoid paying the capital gains tax while providing an accompanying income tax deduction for the current fair-market value.

IRA Charitable Rollover, which is now permanent, provides several benefits. If you are age 70½ or older, you may make a gift up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the Community Foundation. You can specify the way your gift will be used for the betterment of the Wabash Valley while paying no taxes on the transfer. The gift can count against your IRA required minimum distribution (RMD). Congress does not allow you to create or donate to a donor advised fund with an IRA Charitable Rollover.

Transferring life insurance, with the Community Foundation named as the beneficiary and owner of an existing or new policy, allows you an immediate tax deduction, which usually approximates the cash surrender value of the policy.

Private Foundations or Trusts often require significant time and money to manage. By transferring your private foundation or charitable trust to the Community Foundation, all responsibilities for reports and administrative duties will be carried out by the staff of the Community Foundation, which allows you to focus on the charitable purpose. Since the Community Foundation is a public charity and does not pay excise tax, more income is available for charitable purposes.

A deferred gift, made through your will or estate plan, will provide you the opportunity to support the Community Foundation in the future. The Community Foundation will work cooperatively with you and your financial planner, attorney or accountant to create an endowment that will ensure your wishes are properly followed when the gift is ultimately received. The following are considered deferred gifts:

A testamentary gift, or bequest in your will, is one way you can create your charitable legacy.

A charitable remainder trust allows you or someone you choose to receive an income for life from assets transferred to a trust. Creating a charitable remainder trust also qualifies for a current charitable deduction, the amount of which is determined by the age of the income recipient and the payout rate. When the trust ends, the trust remainder is placed in a permanent fund in your name in the Community Foundation, with the charitable distributions made in accordance with your wishes.

A charitable gift annuity is a simple way to make a substantial gift while retaining the right to a fixed annual income for the lifetime(s) of one or two persons. Once the income is no longer paid, the remainder supports the charitable cause you have selected.

A charitable lead trust allows the Community Foundation to receive an annual payment during your lifetime or for a specified number of years. When the trust terminates, the principal is returned to you or others you have designated.

Real estate or personal property may be given to the Community Foundation. Of course, all gifts qualify for a charitable tax deduction in the year the gift was made in accordance with IRS rules.

Acknowledgment: All individuals giving to the Community Foundation are acknowledged for their gift, regardless of size. Should an individual prefer anonymity, the Wabash Valley Community Foundation protects the identity and confidentiality of the individual.



Scholarship Recipient Gives Back



In 2012, Terre Haute South High School graduate Sarah Senseman received the Kimberley Jeanne Fowler Wulf Scholarship for Catholic Education from the Wabash Valley Community Foundation. Though the scholarship did not completely cover the cost of tuition, it certainly helped ease the financial burden when she enrolled at Notre Dame to major in economics and political science.

"Receiving the Kimberley Jeanne Fowler Wulf Scholarship meant a lot in that it showed how much you can help someone, even if you do not necessarily know them," she explained. "You don't have to know someone to make a difference in their life."

During her senior year at Notre Dame, Sarah started interviewing with a consulting company founded by a former Terre Haute resident and Notre Dame graduate. Upon her graduation in 2016, she accepted the job offer and made the move to Washington, D.C., to begin her career in government consulting.

Though she has remained involved with Notre Dame through its alumn chapter, she was determined to find a way to connect her hometown and her beloved alma mater.

"I was fortunate to receive a scholarship," said Sarah. "Notre Dame is a great school, and I was drawn to the sense of family, belonging and community. No matter who you are or where you're from, you find a place of belonging. I wanted to encourage students to apply to Notre Dame and find that place of belonging, but there wasn't any avenue that allowed me to do that [at Notre Dame]."

In 2017, Sarah contacted the Wabash Valley Community Foundation and created the TH 2 ND Fund. The Fund will provide annual scholarships for Vigo County students to attend Notre Dame. With TH 2 ND, Sarah hopes to attract students who have big aspirations but also want to pursue careers in areas that matter.

"With TH 2 ND, one thing I envisioned is going back to Terre Haute South and trying to get students to apply. I wanted to make the [Fund] name casual and informal so they don't underestimate their abilities. Dream big so you can do good work, help people and help the community."

Thanks to the TH 2 ND Fund, Sarah has found a way to give back and connect her hometown and alma mater by providing scholarships for students so that they too may give back to Terre Haute.

Volunteers Growing the Foundation for our Future

Over the course of 25 years, the Community Foundation has been fortunate to have volunteers who have freely given of their time, talent and treasure to help improve the quality of life in the Wabash Valley.

Board members create endowment funds within the Community Foundation so that they may continue to build better communities in perpetuity. The permanency of the funds is a compelling enough reason; however, several have chosen to create funds for reasons near and dear to their hearts.

Clay County Community Foundation board member, Vickie Mace, took advantage of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT VI initiative and established the Melvin E., Rosemary and Eugene Nolte Family Memorial Fund, in memory of her parents and brother. She felt the GIFT VI initiative provided her the perfect opportunity to create a fund to benefit her community while also serving as a lasting legacy in her family's memory.

"The Nolte families were German immigrants that mostly settled in the Posey Township area as farmers," Mace said. "My family name will not carry on, and I would like for the Nolte name to be remembered as those who were early settlers of Clay County through this permanent, lasting fund."

In Sullivan County, former Sullivan County Community Foundation board member Howard Unger created two funds in an effort to memorialize a loved one and to provide an opportunity to benefit Sullivan County.

"The Sallie Unger Scholarship was created shortly after [my late wife's] passing," Unger said. "Sallie had a passion for higher education and for encouraging young people to go into Christian work." The Fund provides post-secondary educational scholarships for individuals attending Lincoln Christian College and Seminary in Lincoln, Illinois.

The Unger Family Fund was recently created by Howard and his wife, Norma Unger, for the primary reason of providing an opportunity for members of the Unger family to make contributions that will benefit Sullivan.

"It's interesting because instead of birthday or Christmas presents, we encourage family members to contribute to the Fund," he explained. "They understand and see what their gifts are doing. It makes them feel as though they are a part of helping their community."


Wabash Valley Community Foundation former president Ron Reeves committed himself to improving the Vigo County community.
