We are pleased to present this annual report to our communities and invite you to read about the impact made in 2021 because of your support and the important work of our grantees and donors. ### Strategic Plan

The Community Foundation adopted a comprehensive strategic plan in 2021 to chart our direction over the next five years. Initiated in late 2020, the strategic planning process included a board retreat, SWOT analysis, focus groups, community leader interviews, research on best practices, as well as benchmarking against other community foundations. Concerted efforts were made to capture many stakeholder voices in a variety of meaningful ways.

### COVID Recovery

In November 2020, the Community Foundation surveyed nonprofit organizations to determine the financial effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The responses showed staggering deficits, with organizations reporting a dramatic reduction in private funding due to canceled fundraisers and programs, loss of earned income revenue and a decrease in individual donations resulting in layoffs, program delivery limitations and risk of closure. The Community Foundation responded by launching the Recovery Phase of its COVID-19 response, in which it allocated over \$230,000 in challenge grants as an opportunity for organizations to recover from the adverse financial effects of the pandemic. ### A Deeply Rooted History of Community Involvement ▶

For nearly 40 years, Hoosier Energy supported the Sullivan County community through various charitable efforts. In April 2021, Hoosier Energy established the Hoosier Energy Endowment Fund for Sullivan County with a \$33,334 gift — affirming its lasting commitment to Sullivan County and its residents. Hoosier Energy’s gift amount leveraged an additional \$66,668 from Lilly Endowment Inc. through its GIFT initiative, resulting in a \$100,000 endowment to benefit Sullivan County forever.

### Planning for the Future

In 2021, the Community Foundation received \$7.8M in bequests, trusts, estate and other gifts to benefit the Wabash Valley. The foresight of these donors and their interest in helping others and giving back to the communities where they lived, worked and enjoyed life will benefit others for many years to come. Estate gifts can also preserve the memory of those who make them, allowing their names and their family names to live on forever, just as the impact of their generosity should live on forever. ### Meeting Challenges ▶

The Community Foundation’s Clay County affiliate awarded a \$75,000 grant to the REIN Coalition to help with the matching challenge for the Wilma and Liston Buell Community Center. This grant was matched at \$2 for every \$1 by an anonymous donor, resulting in a \$225,000 gift for Clay County residents. Read more on page 6.

### Giving Circles

Coordinated by the Community Foundation, these five philanthropic groups provide support for local nonprofit organizations while creating a sense of community. Members gather four times per year, pool together contributions, make nominations and then vote for an organization. To date, these groups have helped leverage over \$1.2 million in permanently endowed funds for the benefit of Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties.

# CONNECTING TO COMMUNITY OPPORTUNITIES

**As you read through this annual report, the common thread that is evident in every story is the sincere desire to improve the quality of life for residents of the Wabash Valley. This can take the form of connecting donors with effective organizations, stewarding giving in times of crisis, championing the work of other nonprofits or by directing resources to address larger community needs and opportunities.**

The REIN Coalition was formed in 2009 in an effort to create a new and unique community center for the benefit of Clay County. Comprised of eight Clay City residents, members selected the name REIN to reflect the planned purpose of the community center: recreation, education, information and nutrition. These four ideologies are what the REIN Coalition strives to provide not only to residents of Clay City, but to those residing in all ten townships of Clay County.

Shortly after its formation, the Coalition identified the need for a facility capable of housing meetings and events for various community organizations. Plans were made to build a conventional metal building and the Coalition has spent the past decade working towards building such a facility that will undoubtedly be an upgrade from the organization's current Orange Building located in Clay City.

"The Orange Building has basically seen its better days," explained Paul Sinderson, Clay County Commissioner. "There is no air conditioning and the heating system does not work well in the winter time. In all honesty, it is time to move on and a new facility would be great to meet the many needs that we have for a meeting place in the Clay City area."

In late 2019, the project received a much-needed boost thanks to an anonymous donor offering a \$2-for-\$1 million challenge grant to the community, up to \$1 million. This challenge grant would assure the construction of a large community center that would not only house a larger food pantry, but would also benefit the YMCA, 4-H clubs, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, and be available for graduation parties, birthday parties, wedding receptions and much more.

Acknowledging the Community Center as an opportunity to invest in the Clay County community, as well as the significant potential impact of such a facility, the Community Foundation's Clay County affiliate awarded the REIN Coalition with a \$75,000 grant toward what will be known as the Wilma and Liston Buell Community Center.

"The Community Foundation had focused on using a portion of its grant dollars for larger projects in Clay County," said Brian Deakins, Wabash Valley Community Foundation board member and president of the Clay County Community Foundation. "We identified the Wilma and Liston Buell Community Center as a significant project that would benefit Clay County residents and were pleased to provide this \$75,000 grant to the REIN Coalition."

In addition to housing the food pantry and being available for organizational use, the Wilma and Liston Buell Community Center will also house a fitness area and library, thereby connecting residents to opportunities in their community.

# INVESTING IN EDUCATION

Nelson Mandela once said, "Education is the most powerful [tool] which you can use to change the world." Education helps people become better citizens, obtain better-paying jobs, shows the importance of hard work and, at the same time, helps people grow and develop.

In 2019, the Community Foundation retained Entrepreneurial Ecosystems (e2) to help community leaders determine the primary drivers for their community's success, thereby serving as a starting point for leaders to focus on genuine development opportunities. One common thread found in each community was that education is considered a strategic priority.

The Vigo County School Corporation (VCSC), together with the Vigo County community, works to inspire students to discover their talents and rise to their greatest potential. Building upon the strengths of its diverse community, the VCSC creates an engaging, comprehensive educational environment that supports the growth of lifelong learners.

In 2021, the VCSC and the Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce launched the first annual Team Vigo Student Leadership Conference (TVSLC) and Service Learning Challenge. The two-day TVSLC equipped high school student leaders both intellectually and practically to run successful programs at their respective high schools and within the community. The conference allowed students to engage with business and educational leaders through activity-filled presentations, professional development breakout sessions and networking opportunities.

The conference also inspired students with a sense of their role in fulfilling the, "See You in Terre Haute 2025 Community Plan." As described in the vision of the Community Plan, "It's a new day in Terre Haute – Vigo County, where citizens, youth, community and government leaders are coming together at one of the community's biggest turning points in history." The TVSLC program works to address students' current and future roles in meeting the goals of the plan.

"The Team Vigo Student Leadership Conference aligns with the talent attraction and retention goals of the Chamber and the See You in Terre Haute Community Plan," explained Kristin Craig, President of the Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce. "We're working to build a stronger community and that starts with the people. We're hoping that the takeaway for students is the potential they have and the potential our community has, as well."

Through the TVSLC, students had the opportunity to attend two field trips to Indianapolis. During the first field trip, students met with leaders in academics, the arts, clubs and athletics, as well as attended a panel discussion. Students also engaged with state representatives on important issues expected in upcoming legislative sessions. During the second Indianapolis field trip, students visited the state capitol, attended a legislative session and met with state officials.

In support of the VCSC's long-term efforts, the Community Foundation invested \$6,500 toward the Team Vigo Student Leadership Conference. This grant assisted the VCSC in exposing students to leadership beyond the local community and helped to strengthen the community's relationship with state leaders.

# STRENGTHENING OUR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

## From Response to Recovery

In 2020, the Community Foundation swiftly implemented its pandemic response, changing much of what we do and how we do it. Within days of the first case being reported in the Wabash Valley, the Community Foundation had established a Rapid Response Grants process that would provide nearly \$100,000 in immediate support with Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties. Within weeks, the Community Foundation, in partnership with the United Way of the Wabash Valley, established its second response – the Wabash Valley COVID-19 Relief Fund. This collaboration resulted in \$1.1 million being granted to nonprofit organizations across six counties.

In December 2020, the Community Foundation launched the Recovery Phase, its third response, by issuing a revenue loss survey to Vigo County nonprofit organizations to determine the financial effects of the pandemic. The survey responses showed staggering deficits, with organizations reporting a dramatic reduction in private funding due to cancelled fundraisers and programs, loss of earned income revenue and a decrease in individual donations resulting in layoffs, program delivery limitations and the risk of closure.

As fundraising efforts are vital to any nonprofit operating budget, the ongoing effects of the pandemic placed the future of some local nonprofit organizations at a severe risk and harmed the trajectory of others. This prompted the Community Foundation to determine how it could create meaningful impact.

The Community Foundation piloted a program of two local nonprofit organizations by issuing \$1-for-\$2 matching challenge grants to provide an infusion of funding in order to maintain operations. The Community Foundation provided a Recovery Grant Program to strengthen two organizations whose missions complement the “See You In Terre Haute 2025 Community Plan.”

The Terre Haute Children’s Museum and the Sheldon Swope Art Museum, due to their presence as Terre Haute attractions and their roles in creating a thriving downtown and vibrant community, received \$1-for-\$2 challenge grants in the amount of \$70,000 and \$15,000, requiring the museums to raise over \$140,000 and \$30,000, respectively. Both entities were successful in their fundraising, exceeding their respective challenges thanks to individuals taking advantage of year-end giving to help the organizations meet their matches.

The overwhelming success of the matching challenge grants allowed for the expansion of the Recovery Grant Program, providing all eligible 501(c)(3) organizations in Clay, Sullivan and Vigo counties the opportunity to apply for up to \$10,000 in a \$1-for-\$2 match. Approximately 23 organizations applied.

## Preserving History

Since 1933, a 20x30 hand painted sign has welcomed visitors to the small town of Bowling Green, Indiana. The impressive structure serves as a sense of pride for residents and provides a brief history of the town, as well as a listing of its founding families.

For nearly nine decades, the sign has required renovation every few years due to weathering. In 2021, officials declared the sign in dire need of repair as the peeling paint made the graphics nearly illegible.

“[This] sign has been up since 1933,” said Darla Frisz, member of Bowling Green Old Settlers. “They have all been hand painted. Depending on what materials you use, they have lasted various amounts of time. Generally five to seven years in most cases.”

To increase the longevity of the sign, officials opted to use durable aluminum composite panels and replaced the hand painted graphics with UV-coated digital prints. Though it is likely the sign will last longer than it has in the past, officials were tasked with raising between \$10,000 and \$20,000 to renovate the structure.

To assist in the renovation and repair of the sign and help preserve Bowling Green and Clay County’s history, the Community Foundation’s Clay County affiliate awarded a grant in the amount of \$8,000. Once the installation is complete, the residents of Bowling Green will once again feel a sense of pride as people visit their small town.

## Delivering Nutritional Care

Established in 1971, the Terre Haute Area Meals on Wheels, Inc. exists to deliver nutritious, diet specific meals year-round to the elderly, sick, disabled, home-bound and at-risk children in Vigo County who cannot provide for themselves. Up until last year, the organization had been operating out the Wabash Activity Center.

“That was fine for a while, but we’ve grown so much that our services are up 189% from two years ago,” said Rita Mace Kaperak, Executive Director of the Terre Haute Area Meals on Wheels. “The residential-style kitchen just isn’t equipped to prepare that many meals and there’s still so many more people who need our services.”



Kaperak explained the plan had been to purchase a building in several years; however, the increased need for services called for immediate action in order to keep from closing down the program.

After securing a loan for the first time in the organization’s history, the Meals on Wheels purchased a building located at 1621 S. 25th Street and used money from its savings account to purchase and/or replace everything needed to become fully licensed with the state of Indiana and the local Board of Health. This new location will allow volunteers to prepare meals in a commercially equipped kitchen, as well as to offer meal opportunities in other communities.

“Meals on Wheels isn’t just for the destitute or the elderly anymore,” said Kaperak. “We’re here to help anybody who’s not eating nutritionally, and we try to feed everyone who calls.”

A Community Foundation grant of \$24,000 replaced lighting, installed a security system, communication system and helped fund Meals on Wheels services in the community.

## Enhancing Community Pride

The Sullivan Area Art Guild (SAG) was established in 1976 by a small group of like-minded artists to encourage and promote art in the Sullivan, Indiana area. A vital part of the Sullivan community, the SAG routinely participates in parades, displays work in community buildings, and offers classes to adults and children to ensure it meets its mission of supporting and enhancing visual art in the community.



Though SAG members have their art displayed in an art gallery, in various windows around town and inside a few businesses, there are no murals.

“We felt [that murals] would greatly enhance our downtown and the city as a whole,” explained Sharon Hawk, SAG member and Gallery and Education Director. “We [received

approval from the business owner] and will be painting a mural on the outside wall of a building that faces the downtown square in Sullivan. We are very excited to see this project develop and finish!”

Hawk said she believes the mural will result in a wonderful piece of visual art for the community and anticipates it will elicit positive feelings from residents of Sullivan County and visitors alike.

“This will bring attention to the importance of visual art in a time that it is being cut from many schools in our county,” she added. “We anticipate there will be others who will want to be part of this creation!”

The SAG is in the process of creating a large scale drawing to prepare for the application onto the wall and will transfer the drawing later this spring. Guild members plan to invite members of the community to help with the painting of the mural, feeling that it will be more valuable to the community if they feel some ownership in its creation.

To assist with the creation of the project and enhance community pride, the Community Foundation awarded a \$2,700 grant.

## Full-circle Scholarship Support

Scholarship funds at the Community Foundation provide annual educational aid for students at institutions of higher learning. Each donor, or group of donors, determines scholarship award conditions, and the diversity of eligibility criteria reflects the variety of donor motivations to create or support scholarship funds. However, each donor shares a common bond in that they establish these scholarships in order to make a difference in the lives of others.

Colonel H. Allen Boyd was among Terre Haute South Vigo High School's first graduating class in 1972. After graduation, he attended Georgia Tech through an Army ROTC Scholarship. For the next four years, Col. Boyd studied aerospace engineering. He graduated in 1976 with a Regular Army commission, and his four-year service commitment turned into a 26-year career as an intelligence officer serving around the world.

After retiring from the Army, Col. Boyd took that experience and the engineering education into industry as an executive with Rockwell Collins in Cedar Rapids, then to ITT Aerospace/Defense in Fort Wayne where he was the general manager of ITT's military communications business until 2010. Since then, he has served as a consultant to both the Army and Defense industries.

"I was blessed with multiple successful careers enabled by a great foundation built in Vigo County Schools and at Georgia Tech," he said. "I could not have gone to college without an ROTC scholarship. It made a huge difference in my life, and my wife and I believe in paying it forward when possible."

One way for Col. Boyd to pay it forward was to establish a scholarship for Terre Haute South Vigo students to encourage and foster collegiate study in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), as Col. Boyd sees those areas of study as critical in the future. In 2021, in celebration of the 50th Anniversary of Terre Haute South Vigo High School, the Community Foundation awarded Col. Boyd's inaugural Terre Haute South Vigo STEM Scholarship of \$10,000 to Alisha Mastakar.

Mastakar, a 2021 graduate of Terre Haute South Vigo High School, is a freshman at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology as a member of the Noblitt Scholars, a program for students with strong academic credentials and a passion to make a difference in the world.

As an Engineering Physics major, Mastakar notes that her major will allow her to delve deep and figure out why and how things work the way they do. Though she is not one hundred percent certain of her career path, her chosen field of study will provide her with an abundance of choices ranging from aerospace, computer, electrical, mechanical and/or nuclear engineering.

Mastakar credits the opportunity to achieve her educational goals and attend the top-rated undergraduate engineering school in the country to the support she has received, such as being the first recipient of the Terre Haute South Vigo STEM Scholarship.

"It's really nice to have this support," she said, explaining that the assistance has empowered her to focus on academics and has opened doors beyond the classroom. One particular door is the chance to explore other avenues to approach her learning. Mastakar enjoys participating in live theater, and she has joined productions at Terre Haute South and in her first semester at Rose-Hulman.

"Theater is a creative outlet," she said, adding, "Engineering is a different type of creativity."

Learning, creativity and paying it forward — all made possible by a common thread.

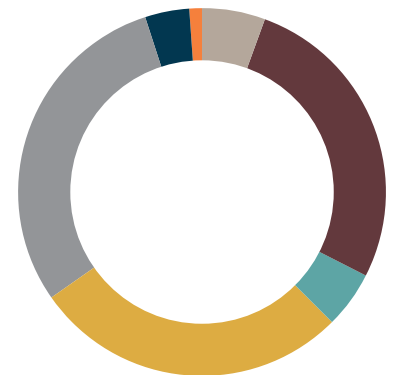
